TWU Bound: Concurrent Admission

Dallas County Community College students who meet Texas Woman's University admission requirements or complete the Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will receive automatic admission to Texas Woman's University. A student may apply for concurrent admission status at the time of first enrollment at any DCCC institution, or at any time thereafter when enrolled at DCCC, by completing a TWU BOUND Program Application. The student's formal application to TWU will be activated when the student has completed the transfer Apply Texas Application for Admission (www.applytexas.org) within 12 months of anticipated

enrollment at TWU and when the university determines that the student meets the TWU transfer admission requirements.

Frequently Asked Questions

Do men attend TWU?

Yes, men make up about 8 to 10 percent of our student population.

Is TWU a private institution?

No. We are a public institution, making our tuition and fees significantly lower than those of private universities.

How many credits are needed to get a degree from TWU?

Most degrees require 120 credit hours.

How much does it cost to attend?

See chart below for total estimated expenses.

Does TWU offer online or distance learning classes?

Yes. Offerings vary by departments. For more information, visit www.twu.edu/de.

Can I get a degree by attending night, evening and weekend classes?

Yes, depending on the major. For more information, call the TWU Office of Lifelong Learning at 940-898-3408, or visit www.twu.edu/lifelong

How many of my credits will transfer to TWU?

Up to 84 hours will transfer from community colleges. There is no limit on credits from 4-year institutions.

What type of scholarships does TWU offer?

See below for details regarding scholarships. The scholarship deadline for fall is March 1.

What are the priority application deadlines?

Fall — July 1; Spring — Nov. 1

Can I apply online?

Yes. Go to www.ApplyTexas.org.

Can I register online?

Yes. Accepted Students can go to www.twu.edu and click on the "Pioneer Portal" icon.

Are transfer students required to attend orientation?

Those who have fewer than 13 hours are required to attend orientation.

What is considered part-time?

Fewer than 12 hours per semester.

How long does it take to process my application?

Please allow 2-4 weeks to process after all required documents are submitted. International student applications may require additional time to process.

How much is the application fee?

The non-refundable application fee is \$50. The fee is \$75 for international applicants.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

TWU Scholarship Information

Deadline: March 1

TWU awards more than \$1.4 million in new student scholarships annually. Although many are awarded on academic merit, some are awarded to students who have exceptional financial circumstances and/or demonstrate achievement in other areas. Also, most of these scholarships are renewable each year based upon grade point average.

Applications are available online at www.twu.edu/finaid.

Transfer Student Scholarships

Transfer Student awards range from \$500-\$2,300 per year. Students transferring to TWU from accredited junior colleges or four-year institutions with more than 15 credit hours may apply for this scholarship. This scholarship is awarded on a combination of cumulative grade point average and number of hours transferred to TWU and can be renewed with cumulative 3.0 GPA.

Phi Theta Kappa scholarships are \$2,300 a year. Applicants must be active members of Phi Theta Kappa. Proof of PTK membership must be provided. Students with a bachelor's degree are not eligible. Awards are for full-time students only. This scholarship can be

renewed with a cumulative 3.0 grade point average and proven participation in the PTK chapter.

General Scholarships

TWU General Academic Scholarship:

Awards are \$500-\$1,800 per year. This scholarship is available to new students, continuing students, undergraduates and graduate students. Students must reapply for this scholarship each year. This scholarship is awarded strictly on the basis of cumulative grade point average.

Departmental Scholarships: Each department at TWU has scholarship funds available to award. Students should contact the chairperson of the department in which they will be majoring for more information.

Scholarship: Awards are \$1,200 per year. This scholarship is available to entering students and TWU students who have completed at least 24 credit hours. Applicants must complete the "Reitch Supplemental Questions" on the TWU Scholarship Application.

Students who are awarded scholarships will receive a personalized scholarship offer letter from the TWU Financial Aid Office. Students must return the letter by the deadline to avoid having the scholarship canceled. Students who are not awarded scholarships also will be notified.

may be eligible. This scholarship requires a minimum 3.0 GPA and 60 credit hours. Applicants must contact their DCCC campus Rising Star adviser for instructions and application materials.

Out-of-state waivers: Out-of-state students who are awarded \$1,000 or more in TWU academic scholarship funds may qualify to pay tuition at the Texas resident rate. Eligible students will be notified if they qualify for an out-of-state tuition waiver.

Financial Aid

Eligibility: To be considered for financial aid, students must meet the following criteria:

- ▶ Be a United States citizen or permanent resident for most awards.
- ▶ Be accepted by TWU into a degree or certification program. Students admitted with non-degree status are not eligible for grants, loans or federal work-study programs.
- ▶ Most financial aid programs require students to take a minimum of six credit hours at TWU.
- ▶ If you are a male, be registered with Selective Service or be exempt.
- ▶ Not be in default on an educational loan or owe a refund for an educational grant.

Texas Grants

A Texas Grant could help pay for your bachelor's degree, if you receive an associate's degree from

an eligible community college and enroll at TWU within 12 months after graduation. Students enrolled under SB1528 are eligible to apply. See www.collegefortexans.com for details.

Tuition Rebates

Students who wish to participate in the \$1,000 tuition rebate plan must:

- ▶ attempt no more than three hours in excess of the minimum number of semester credit hours required to complete their degree. The minimum total includes transfer credit and credit earned by examination, and
- ▶ complete their undergraduate study within the three-attempted-hour limit.

Students accept responsibility for monitoring their own progress toward degrees and for making choices that will allow them to graduate within the limit. Specific information and the required agreement form are available from the Registrar's Office.

Applications submitted after the deadlines will be processed, but may result in the late receipt of funds.

take the course either for core credit or for credit toward the major, provided the department of the student's major approves.

Academic Minor

The academic minor is not a university-wide requirement. When a minor is required, the major and minor subjects must be in separate departments except in the Departments of Visual Arts; Biology; Communication Sciences and Disorders; History and Government; English, Speech, and Foreign Languages; Mathematics and Computer Science; School of Management; and Sociology and Social Work. When a minor is chosen in one of the departments listed above, it must be in a different field from the major subject. MINOR (if applicable):

- ▶ Number of hours set by degree plan.
- ▶ Minimum of 6 advanced semester hours
- ▶ Minimum of 3 advanced semester hours taken at TWU

Academic Information

Academic Advising

Transfer students with over 12 hours will, in most instances, meet with a faculty adviser in their major program prior to registering each semester. Transfer students who are seeking a pre-professional program but do not meet the criteria for the program are advised by the department of their major. Students work with an advisor to develop a schedule of courses needed to complete degree requirements.

Transfer students who have completed the TSI requirements are eligible to take upper division courses. If all parts of the requirements have not been completed, students must work through the advisor to complete requirements. All students in teacher certification programs must take a TSI test, unless exempt.

Academic Major

All bachelor's degrees require a minimum of 120 semester credit hours. An academic major consists of 30 or more hours, one-half of which must be at the 3000 or 4000 level. Students must take 25% of all hours required for the degree at TWU. Half of major and half of minor must be taken at TWU. A "C" average must be maintained in major courses.

A course taken for core credit in the department of the student's major cannot be counted in the hours applied to the major. In addition, departments may specify which core courses may be taken by their majors and may specify that a course taken for core credit is a prerequisite for a course that gives credit in the major. If a course in a student's major field is also approved for core credit, the student may elect to

Advanced Hours Requirement

A minimum of 36 advanced hours is required for any baccalaureate degree. An advanced course for a baccalaureate degree is one that is numbered 3000 or 4000. Some majors require 12 hours of a foreign language for the Bachelor of Arts degree. That requirement may be met as follows: 12 hours (excluding lab hours) of the same foreign language, six hours of which must be in the second year; or three hours of American Sign Language and nine hours of a foreign language (excluding lab hours), six hours of which must be in the second year and in the same foreign language.

Distance Education

TWU offers more than 200 distance learning courses. A distance learning course is one in which 50 percent of the instruction is delivered via satellite, compressed video, Internet, or other electronic means. All distance learning courses/ programs are subject to the same academic standards as those offered on campus. Visit the TWU web for more information: www.twu.edu/de/.

Core Curriculum Transfer Policy

Following the program plans in this Transfer Handbook assures that students who complete the state's core curriculum at DCCC, and whose transcripts are labeled "Core Complete," will not need to take any additional core curriculum courses at TWU.

The state requires a minimum of 42 hours for the core curriculum. However, some plans associated with the applied sciences degrees do not include completion of the DCCC core curriculum. Students who do not bring a completed core curriculum to TWU receive credit for core courses taken at DCCC and are required to complete remaining courses in the TWU Core Curriculum.

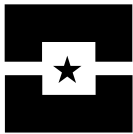

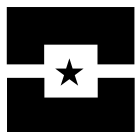

Associate in Sciences to Bachelor of Science in Biology

This curriculum is designed for students who plan to complete an Associate in Sciences at Dallas County Community College and then transfer to Texas Woman's University to complete a Bachelor of Science in Biology. This plan includes completion of the core curriculum at DCCC. DCCC core requires completion of competencies: meeting TSI requirements, computer literacy, and EDUC 1300 Learning Frameworks.

This plan includes completion of the DCCC core curriculum. DCCC core requires completion of competencies: meeting TSI requirements, computer literacy, and EDUC 1300 Learning Frameworks.

NOTE: Students are auditioned to determine placement in ballet and modern dance technique courses and progress through graded levels; each level representing one year of study. To ensure safe and sound preparation, a student progresses to the next level upon recommendation of the Technique Committee. Except where indicated in the teacher certification program, each dance major must register for at least one dance technique course each semester. A grade of C or better is necessary before enrolling in a succeeding course in the choreography sequence. A grade of C or better must be earned in all courses required for the dance major. In each of the areas of Technique, Choreography, and Performance, fifty-percent of the hours must be taken at TWU.

The goal of the program is to prepare students for dance careers in a variety of artistic and educational settings. Detailed degree plans are available from the Department of Dance Office of TWU.

Pre-Occupational Therapy Undergraduate Programs

The School of Occupational Therapy is accredited by ACOTE and given the highest recognition. To enter a career as an occupational therapist a graduate degree is required. The School of Occupational Therapy participates in an accelerated plan of study on the Denton campus that is structured for students who are entering or currently engaged in undergraduate course work. This plan, the pre-OT degree plan, combines the undergraduate and graduate levels of study needed to become a registered occupational therapist. This plan potentially enables a student to complete the Master of Occupational Therapy degree in 5½ years.

Under the pre-OT degree plan students from the undergraduate majors of child development, family studies, kinesiology, health studies, or psychology complete core requirements, the required courses in the major, and the prerequisite courses for the MOT program. Transfer students can fit readily into these pathways by completing the state core curriculum at their community college prior to following a pre-OT degree plan within one of the five majors at Texas Woman's University.

Undergraduate students following a pre-OT degree plan may apply to the School of Occupational Therapy for approval to begin occupational therapy coursework as an undergraduate student. The undergraduate degree plan determines whether the student completes one or two semesters of occupational therapy coursework as part of the undergraduate degree. A predetermined number of students can be accepted based on availability of clinical facilities, space, and faculty. Entrance is competitive. Selection is based on:

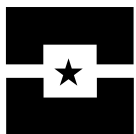
- Academic performance
- On-campus interview
- Writing sample
- Therapist recommendation after completion of 20 volunteer hours with an occupational therapist
- Total number of students that can be admitted in the program

One semester prior to undergraduate degree completion, students taking occupational therapy coursework apply to the Graduate School. Additional details and admission requirements appear in the TWU General Catalog.

The Master of Occupational Therapy program is accredited by the Accreditation Council of Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE*). With successful completion of the Master of Occupational Therapy degree, the student is eligible to apply for the certification examination given by the National Board for Certification of Occupational Therapy (www.nbcot.org). Note: Students are advised that NBCOT may deny an individual's application to take the exam if he or she has a criminal felony conviction. The School of OT recommends that students with a felony conviction contact NBCOT for an "early determination review."

Pre-Physical Therapy Undergraduate Programs

Physical Therapy is a graduate program. You will need a bachelor's degree and the required prerequisite courses to be eligible to apply. It will take an average of 7 years to become a physical therapist - typically, 4 years to complete a bachelor's degree and 3 years to complete the Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program.

TWU offers several Pre-PT degree plans which incorporate the required prerequisite courses so you are eligible to apply to the DPT in the beginning of your senior year at TWU. TWU offers Pre-PT bachelor degrees in Kinesiology, Biology, Psychology, Health Studies, Child Development and Nutrition to prepare you for the physical therapy program. It is best to complete your bachelor's degree in a field of your interest since the DPT program is very competitive to enter. We suggest you begin observing/ volunteering in the PT field (keep track of your hours) to help you decide if this is the field for you. It is best not to take all of your prerequisites at the community college level but rather become core complete and include some math and at least two semesters of two different sciences for science majors.

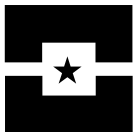
The required prerequisite courses for the DPT program:

- **Two semesters of biology or zoology with laboratory (8 credits)** Biology for non-science majors, anatomy, physiology, kinesiology, botany, and ecology are not accepted.
- **Two semesters of chemistry with laboratory (8 credits)** Chemistry for non-science majors is not accepted.
- **Two semesters of basic physics with laboratory (8 credits)** Physics for non-science majors is not accepted.
- One semester of college **algebra AND** one semester of college **trigonometry, OR** One semester of **pre-calculus, OR** One semester of **calculus**
- Six hours of **psychology** (excluding statistics) (**6 credits**) General, developmental, abnormal are recommended.
- **Statistics (3 credits within the last 10 years)** Psychology-based is recommended but others are accepted.
- One semester of general upper level (3000 or 4000) physiology (at a 4-year university) with laboratory (preferably human); **OR Two semesters of anatomy and physiology with laboratory** (8 credits); **OR** One semester of anatomy and physiology with laboratory **PLUS** One semester of exercise physiology.
- A course **in medical terminology**.

Fast Track Option:

At TWU, we offer a Fast Track program that allows students to complete the bachelor's and the DPT program in 6 years instead of 7. We suggest students only complete one year at a community college (30 hours) if interested in this option as the student must begin taking upper level courses in their sophomore year to stay on track. We offer the Fast Track in Human Biology, Kinesiology, Health Studies and Psychology. The Fast Track option requires taking courses during each summer semester along with 15-16 credits in the fall and spring semesters, so that you can complete the majority of your bachelor's degree in 3 years. If accepted to the DPT program, up to 8 credits from the first semester of the DPT program will fulfill your final credits for your bachelor's degree. The Fast Track program is not a guaranteed acceptance into the program; you will need to maintain a high GPA and be a competitive applicant in all other areas too. You apply to the DPT program in the beginning of your 3rd year but your TWU degree requirements and prerequisites must be completed before beginning the DPT program in your 4th year so you must work closely with your department advisor. We highly suggest completing your physiology requirement before applying to the DPT. By shortening your time for the bachelor's degree, you also have less time to complete your observation hours.

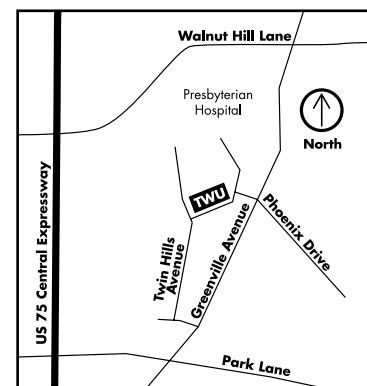
Parkland Campus

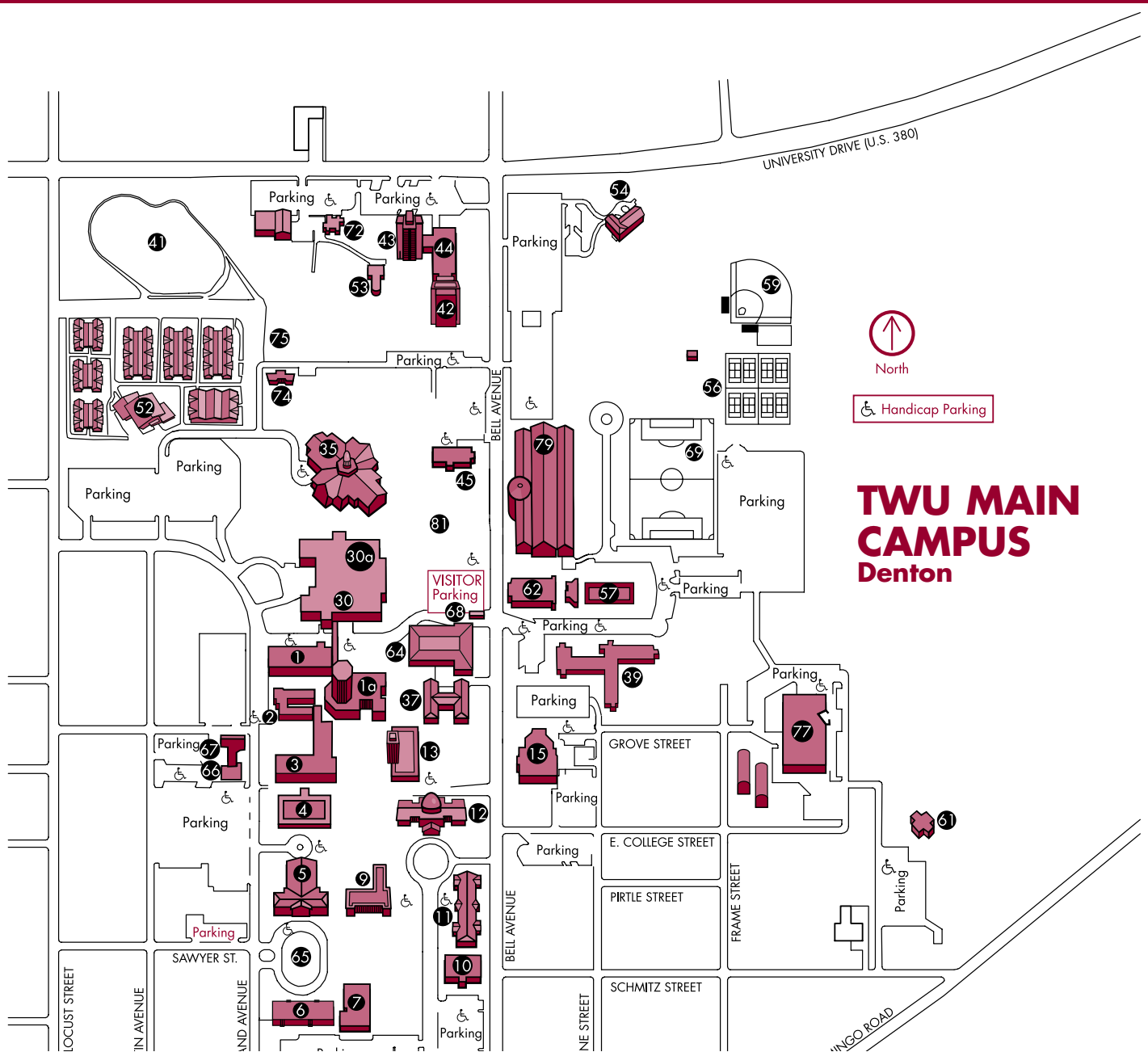


Presbyterian Campus
