Take an optional Research Project course on a topic of your choice, enabling you to conduct primary research with expert interviews in Washington, D.C. (3 credits), or choose from a variety of elective courses.

SEMINARS

Our distinguished program emphasizes experiential education in Washington, D.C., providing students the opportunity to learn directly from experts and to visit key organizations. The weekly seminar session, led by a Washington Semester Program professor, provides students with diverse opportunities including:

- Professional development advice and discussion to help you make the most of your internship experience.
- Guest speakers and site visits at well known organizations active in your field such as: US Supreme Court, FBI, Washington Post, NBC News, the State Department, Congressional Representatives, and the World Bank.
- Discussion sessions focused on current event topics related to your seminar field. For example, in Justice and Law you may visit the Supreme Court and discuss recent cases decided by the Court. While in International Affairs, after visiting the State Department, you can discuss current foreign policy priorities and challenges.
- Comparison of the roles and capacities of 'key actors' in your field as you hear directly from experts and visit their organizations. This 'hands-on' experience offers broad professional development opportunities.
- Classes, instruction, guest speakers, and diverse assignments that help you to make valuable connections in your field and strengthen your résumé with real-world experience, all while earning academic credit.

After you have accepted an internship, your summer seminar professor will provide you with advice and assistance in making the most of that experience and other professional development opportunities.
