HIST 5303	Progressives	<i>The early twentieth century era and its social movements; politics, gender and race issues along with the nation's foreign policy and the continuity of society's social development from a historical perspective.</i>
HIST 5333	The Gilded Age	<i>Transformation from an agricultural economy to the mercantile society of American industrialism; impact of speculators, entrepreneurs, industry leaders, and railroad promoters.</i>
HIST 5403	American Experience in World War II	<i>How America shaped the War and how the War shaped America including military, social, political and economic aspects; traditional historians' view on the period.</i>
HIST 5413	Civil Rights	<i>Social, political and legal concepts of the Civil Rights Movement; historical and legal issues of Jim Crow laws, Plessy vs. Ferguson, and Brown vs. Board of Education Supreme Court decisions; peaceful protests; forms of social disorder in a quest for equal rights.</i>
HIST 5423	Native Americans	<i>Relations between European settlers and Native American tribes with emphasis on cultural differences, land use and government-tribe relations.</i>
HIST 5473	Vietnam War	<i>Historical context of American involvement in the Vietnam conflict; political decisions of the Kennedy, Johnson and Nixon administrations; impact of the war on political protest and social unrest; courts resolution of related controversies; legacy of the war.</i>
HIST 5483	War, National Security and Civil Liberties	<i>Public policy solutions regarding the balance between maintaining national security and protecting civil liberties; history of the nation's attempts to evaluate security policies from colonial times to current events.</i>
HIST 5503	Between the Wars	<i>Social, political, and economic history of the U.S. and the wars for particular eras; consumerism, conflicts, music, and literature during the interwar time period.</i>
HIST 5603	Professional Practices	<i>Professional practices engaged in by individuals with advanced degrees in history and political science; exploration of issues related to teaching, research, and service.</i>

HIST 5703	U.S. Since 1945	<i>Social, political, economic, and multicultural history of the United States from 1945 to September 11th; the Cold War and its influence on American politics, beliefs, and post-Cold War realities; military conflicts, foreign policy, multicultural experiences, and domestic challenges.</i>
HIST 5753	Age of Industrialism	<i>Historical, cultural and legal context for transformation of United States to urbanized, industrial power between 1870 and 1920; impact of railroads, the "Robber Barons," and struggles between organized labor and management.</i>
HIST 5803	Oral History Methodology	<i>Theories, methods, and debates surrounding the oldest historical tool, oral history; methodology for conducting oral histories, debate and completing transcripts; consideration of privacy, storage and accessibility.</i>
MATH 1553	Mathematics Concepts IV	<i>Strategies for teaching 7th and 8th grade mathematics. Topics selected from real number systems; fundamental operations of mathematics; algebraic thinking; geometry; measurement; probability; and statistics. Can only be counted as satisfying mathematics requirement for students seeking 4-8 certification.</i>
MATH 5593	Differential Equations	<i>The existence and uniqueness for differential equations and systems of differential equations. General theory to specific types of differential equations of a single variable. Basic theory for linear and nonlinear systems; linearization; stability; Hamiltonian Systems; applications with MAPLE.</i>
MU 2202	Introduction to Music Education	<i>Incorporation of learning styles, assessment tools and lesson planning, technology, diversity, and behavior management specific to the music classroom. State music contest (UIL) preparation, professional organizations, and historical development and philosophy of music education.</i>
MU 2543	History of Rock 'n' Roll Music	<i>Origins of rock 'n' roll music in the mid-20th century in the U.S., including the influence and hybridization of earlier music styles such as blues, gospel, country and popular, and its stylistic development in the U.S. and abroad to the present; sociological, cultural and political impact of rock music and its role and function in society.</i>
MU 3052	Instrumental Techniques and Pedagogy	<i>Introduction to instruments for music educators. Rehearsal objectives, instructional techniques and materials for beginning band and orchestra; rehearsal management and organization; diagnostic skills for teaching performance fundamentals; and lab school field experience.</i>
MU 3402	Vocal Literature	<i>A historic survey of standard vocal literature, specifically art songs from the Renaissance to the 20th century.</i>
MU 3441	Marching Band Practicum	<i>Organization and management of marching bands and an examination of software designed for writing drills. Placement as marching band assistants in area high school or college marching bands.</i>
MU 3442	English, Italian and Latin Diction	<i>replaced MU 3453; Articulation and pronunciation competencies for singing in English, Italian and Latin languages, focusing on the sounds and symbols of the International Phonetic Alphabet and rules for singing diction.</i>

MU 3452	French and German Diction	<i>replaced MU 3463; Articulation and pronunciation competencies for singing in French and German languages, focusing on the sounds and symbols of the International Phonetic Alphabet and rules for singing diction.</i>
MU 3601	Advanced Conducting	<i>Application of the technical and expressive aspects of conducting, score study techniques, ensemble concepts, historical performance styles, and error detection skills.</i>
MU 3602	Secondary Methods and Literature	<i>Methods, materials and pedagogy related to the teaching of choral and instrumental music in the middle school and high school levels.</i>

Field work in schools required.</i>
READ 6753	Advanced Clinical Practicum in Early Literacy Leadership	<i>Application of expertise in early literacy and early intervention leadership. Participation in the implementation of early literacy teacher courses and early intervention in schools and systems, teaching adult learners, and use of data to refine and evaluate implementation. DH 3433	Oral Radiology	<i>Principles of x-ray production and safety factors; application and theory of proper exposure, processing and mounting radiographs, radiographic interpretation including recognition and identification of normal anatomic landmarks and selected pathologic conditions.</i>
DH 3504	Clinical Dental Hygiene II	<i>Continuing guided practice sessions, provision of the dental hygiene process of care to patients with relatively uncomplicated needs; assisting, as well as other adjunct clinical procedures, and discussion of clinical cases.</i>
DH 3513	Dental Hygiene Process of Care	<i>Dental hygiene process of care for patients with greater treatment needs; dentinal hypersensitivity, self-assessment in the clinical environment, periodontal debridement. Dental caries management, sealants, pain control, and preparation for medical emergencies.</i>
DH 3553	Community Oral Health	<i>Principles, practices and methods of dental public health, including oral health education; emphasis on the role of the dental hygienist in community oral and interdisciplinary health programs.</i>
DH 4002	Transitional Dental Hygiene Clinic	<i>A mock office practice appropriate to the individual student's level of clinical competency with emphasis on appropriate time utilization. May also be taken as a refresher course for those who would like to update clinical skills before re-entry into the profession.</i>

DH 4404	Clinical Dental Hygiene III	<i>Integration of dental hygiene process of care using evidence-based decision-making for the patient with early to moderate periodontal disease, continue to provide care to patients with less complicated needs, oral health education and adjunct procedures.</i>
DH 4412	Advanced Clinical Dental Hygiene	<i>Preparation for transition to practitioner and to experiences with patients with higher difficulty levels & more complex medical problems. Includes pain control, Texas Dental Practice Act and Rules of Texas State Board of Dental Examiners and continued portfolio development.</i>
DH 4423	General and Oral Pathology	<i>General pathology as related to systemic changes impacting oral conditions with emphasis on diseases and pathologies of the oral cavity and head and neck.</i>
DH 4431	Community Oral Health Practicum	<i>Experiences in assessing, planning, implementation and evaluation for the purpose of community oral health programming with diverse populations in a variety of settings.</i>
DH 4443	Dental Hygiene Care for Special Needs	<i>Unique characteristics and needs of pediatric, adolescent and geriatric patients related to oral health care & for patients who present with the most common medical conditions that require modified treatment or specialized oral health education.</i>
DH 4451	Dental Materials	<i>Physical and chemical properties, indications for use, and use of dental materials commonly utilized in dental hygiene and selected materials used in dentistry.</i>
DH 4461	Applied Dental Materials	<i>Manipulation, application, use, evaluation, and safe use of a variety of dental materials currently used in oral healthcare.</i>
DH 4471	Dental Hygiene Clinical Cases	<i>Use of the case study method for dental hygienists, including analysis and evaluation of dental hygiene cases, and planning for initiation of individual specialized case studies.</i>
DH 4512	Senior Clinical Seminar	<i>Exploration of clinical issues and principles as they arise, including additional clinical functions; opportunities to increase skill in critical thinking through use of case studies, completion of portfolio.</i>
DH 4521	Applied DH Diagnosis and Advanced Radiology	<i>Pathophysiology and diagnostic indicators for common oral conditions with special emphasis on radiologic evidence. Differential diagnosis & definitive diagnosis as apply to practice of dental hygiene. Principles for presentation of diagnosis to patient and/or interdisciplinary and intradisciplinary healthcare providers.</i>
DH 4541	Current Issues in Dental Hygiene	<i>Exploration of and professional response to evolving topics and/or problems and potential solutions as they relate to the current state of oral healthcare and oral health education.</i>

DH 4883	Dental Hygiene Clinical and Classroom Teaching Methodology	<i>Educational concepts, including educational theory and methodology, applied to clinical dental hygiene and classroom teaching; differentiation between skill, knowledge and techniques for dental hygiene clinical practice in contrast to what is required for dental hygiene education.</i>
DH 4893	Alternative Dental Hygiene Professional Careers Practicum	<i>Exploration of alternative dental hygiene practice settings and opportunities; DH education, community-based dental practice, public health dentistry, research, and business/management; internship in one of these settings; development of resume, curriculum vitae, and professional portfolio.</i>
HCA 5363	Leadership and Career Development	<i>Development of leadership potential by strengthening abilities in creative thinking, interpersonal team skills, communication (oral and written) and listening skills, diversity issues, negotiation and conflict management. Improvement of personal effectiveness by goal setting, establishing networks, using interviewing techniques and increasing self awareness. Use of self assessments, and group projects with outside clients. Includes student preparation of portfolio presentation/notebook, individual meetings with instructor and presentation to independent evaluators.</i>
KINS 5463	Legal Issues in Sport	<i>Application of legal theories to the sport industry with specific focus on tort law, constitutional law, contract law, negligence and risk management, and Title IX.</i>
NFS 3083	BioNutrition	<i>Fundamental principles of biochemistry for nutrition, covering protein, carbohydrate, fat, vitamin and energy metabolism; underlying causes and rationale for the prevention and treatment of diseases.</i>
NFS 3473	Preventive Nutrition	<i>Major causes of morbidity and mortality; dietary nutrients that play a role in the prevention of disease; dietary guidelines for health promotion; educational materials to promote healthy living.</i>

NFS 5473	Advanced Preventive Nutrition	<i>Types of prevention; evidence for the role of dietary nutrients in preventing major causes of morbidity and mortality (e.g., cardiovascular disease, cancer); national goals for health promotions; dietary guidelines for health promotion and disease prevention; position statements on diet and health.</i>
NFS 5521	Nutrition for Collegiate and Professional Sports	<i>Application of evidence-based nutrition information in real-life sports settings. NFS 5693	Nutrition and Metabolic Syndrome	<i>Pathophysiology of metabolic syndrome; metabolic syndrome and cardiovascular disease; relevance of nutrition in development and treatment of metabolic syndrome.</i>
NFS 5723	Nutritional Care Applications	<i>Exploration, analysis and application of principles of the nutrition care process, nutritional assessment, and methods of nutrition support. Provides the foundation for nutrition care skills in the clinical setting.</i>
