2. Parents' names and hometown(s)
3. Grandparents' names and hometowns
4. Spouse's name
5. Name of your high school and year of graduation
6. Honors and activities at TWU (i.e., graduated magna cum laude, president of Golden Key Honour Society, etc.)

You may include any additional information you choose.
