**Anita Tijerina Revilla, Ph.D.** is an assistant professor in the Department of Women's Studies at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. She received her Ph.D. at the UCLA Graduate School of Education and Information Studies within the division of Social Sciences and Comparative Education with a specialization in Race & Ethnic Studies. Her master's degree was earned from Teachers College, Columbia University in Anthropology and Education and Bilingual/Bicultural Studies. She received her undergraduate degree from Princeton University where she studied Religion and Latin American, African American, and American Studies.

Dr. Revilla's areas of expertise include Chicana/o Studies, Critical Race Theory, Critical Race Feminism, Latino/a Critical Theory and Education. Her independent research focuses on the intersections of race, class, gender, sexuality, and immigrant status in the experiences of Chicanas/os and Latinas/os, especially as it relates to feminist and Queer student activism, social movements, and social justice education. Her recent publications include *Both Sides Now: The Stories of Desegregation's Graduates* (UC Press) and "Inmensa Fe en la Victoria [Immense Faith in Victory]: Social Justice Through Education," in A. Castañeda's *Gender on the Borderlands: The Frontiers Reader* (University of Nebraska Press). Currently, she is working on two books, *Marching Students: Chicana/o Identity and the Politics of Education 1968 and the Present* and *Raza Womyn Reconstructing Revolution: Teaching Social Justice through Muxerista Consciousness*.
