Human Rights Initiative of North Texas provides free legal services to victims of human rights abuses. *HRI* works with those who seek safe haven in the United States after suffering religious, social or political persecution in their homelands. *HRI* also responds to other legal needs that traditional refugee services do not: in cases of human trafficking and violence against immigrant women and children. The Client Services department at HRI consistently attempts to improve the situations of clients as they struggle to build new lives in the United States.

The **Partnership Development Intern** will be charged with establishing cooperative relationships and voucher programs with several surrounding nonprofits in targeted categories, such as food, clothing and medical assistance in order to create a safety net of resources and assistance for our neediest and most vulnerable clients. In addition to developing relationships, the intern will help make revisions to the HRI website in order to reflect new partnerships. As a member of the Client Services department the intern will also participate in client services intakes and direct client assistance as needed.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must be a current full-time undergraduate enrolled at an accredited college or university.
- Must be returning as a full-time undergraduate, and have at least sophomore standing in the Fall 2010.
- Interest in marketing/business development or public relations are strongly encouraged, but not required.
- Candidates must possess strong organizational, written and verbal communication skills.
