## 2010 PARKLAND AUXILIARY COLLEGIATE FELLOWS PROGRAM

### PROGRAM HISTORY

The Parkland Health & Hospital Systems Collegiate Fellows Program was created in the early 1980's and is sponsored by the Parkland Health & Hospital System's Auxiliary. The nine week long summer program is designed to provide students with a quality learning experience in one of the nation's finest hospitals.

### GOALS

The program is designed for those students who would not otherwise have an opportunity to work in a health care setting. The practical experience gained from the program is intended to complement the academic training received throughout the school year. It is hoped that such an experience will help students to define and focus on their career goals. Because of the hospital's international reputation for excellence, the program strives to share this excitement with tomorrow's health care professionals.

### PROGRAM FORMAT

Up to twenty students will be selected for the program. Every effort will be made to place the student in a department that will encourage and enhance his or her interest in medicine. Once assigned, the student will have an opportunity to work closely with the hospital staff and take an active role in the service delivery process. **Please be advised the program does not guarantee exclusive shadowing experiences of any particular profession, but exposure to a combination of health care professions.** In addition, educational programs and community service projects are conducted for the students outside their assigned departments. Activities include participating in tours of the various hospital departments, community service and meeting with hospital administrators and medical staff. All participants will be honored with an awards luncheon at the end of the program. Those students that wish to participate in the following year's program are not guaranteed placement and must reapply for the program. Those students receiving a favorable recommendation from their supervisor will be given first priority for placement in the following year's program. Participation in the program is limited to two years.

### ELIGIBILITY

Students who have completed a minimum of 30 semester hours of college course work and who **have not** graduated from college and do not anticipate graduation until December 2010, are eligible for the program. In addition, applicants must be interested in pursuing a career in **healthcare, or health care administration**, as well as, a resident of Dallas County or its surrounding areas.

## APPLICATION PROCESS

**APPLICATION DEADLINE: FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 05, 2010.**

Please review the following application requirements carefully. All required items must be submitted together in order to be considered for the program.

**1. RESUME=**

Your resume should include the following

- All high schools, college and universities attended
- All work experience (***paid and volunteer***)
- Your career objective

**2. COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT**

Copies of transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.  
(Ensure entire Fall of 2009 semester is included)

**3. PERSONAL STATEMENT**

Please write a 500 word personal statement addressing who you are, why you have chosen this field, and your expectations of the program. Personal statements may be prepared on the enclosed form entitled A Personal Statement @ or on a separate page. **THE STATEMENT MUST BE COMPLETED IN TYPEWRITTEN FORM.**

**4. DEFINING MOMENT STATEMENT**

Provide a brief detailed explanation with each question. Please be as thorough and as honest as possible. The Defining Moment statements can be prepared on the enclosed form entitled "Defining Moment" or a separate piece of paper. **ALL SECTIONS (front and back) MUST BE COMPLETED IN TYPEWRITTEN FORM.**

**5. EVALUATION FORMS**

Two typewritten evaluation forms are required. One evaluation must be completed by a college professor, academic advisor or current/former supervisor. The second evaluation may be completed by any other professional contact (no relatives). Evaluation forms should be sent directly to the address below (separate from the package).

**6. PROGRAM AGREEMENT**

Please read the agreement carefully and sign.

**IMPORTANT NOTE!!!**

Applications will not be considered complete until all of the documents listed above have been received. Applications received (not postmarked) AFTER the deadline WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED. **Facsimiles will not be accepted.**
