JOB SUMMARY

Performs the duties of transcript evaluation of foreign and domestic credentials. Work is performed under general supervision and performance is based upon completion of assignments and results obtained. The performance evaluation is conducted through the performance evaluation system and in accordance with the University Policies & Procedures.

PRIMARY DUTIES - *May include, but not limited to the following:*

Performs transcript evaluation of foreign and domestic credentials.
Completes preliminary degree plan for new international students.
Maintains transcript files, current catalog files, and equivalency tables.
Corresponds with foreign and domestic prospective students.
Answers questions from prospective students via phone, in person, and e-mail.
Confers with students and their school officials concerning eligibility.
Prepares letters of transfer recommendation for department and per student request.
Assists and advises students with course transfer, degree equivalencies, and admissions procedures.
Corresponds with students, faculty, and departments relative to student status.

ADDITIONAL DUTIES

Performs other duties as requested.

EDUCATION

High school diploma required. Bachelor's degree preferred.

EXPERIENCE

Minimum of one year of experience in an academic admissions office or international student office required.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES - The following are essential:

Working knowledge of office practices and methods.

Ability to coordinate work with other employees, providing direct instruction or supervision as assigned.

Ability to organize work effectively, conceptualize and prioritize objectives and exercise independent judgment based on an understanding of organizational policies and activities.

Ability to establish and maintain effective work relationships with students, faculty, staff, and the public.

Ability to communicate effectively orally, by phone, in person, and in writing.

Ability to represent the department and University in a friendly, courteous, and professional manner.

Ability to use a personal computer and other office equipment.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is occasionally required to stand, walk, sit, use hands to finger, handle or feel objects, tools or controls, reach with hands and arms, climb stairs, talk or hear.
