Significance and Contribution of New Knowledge: The doctoral candidate is able to articulate the significance of the research, its contribution to scholarship, and how it will inform her or his future scholarly and academic endeavors.					
Verbal Communication Skills: The candidate is able to make a clear and articulate verbal presentation of the significance and contribution of the research and respond to questions with substance in a scholarly and professional manner.					
Ability to Engage in Verbal Discourse: The candidate is able to respond to questions during the oral defense in a manner that reflects a deep understanding of the dissertation research and its place in the larger world of scholarship.
