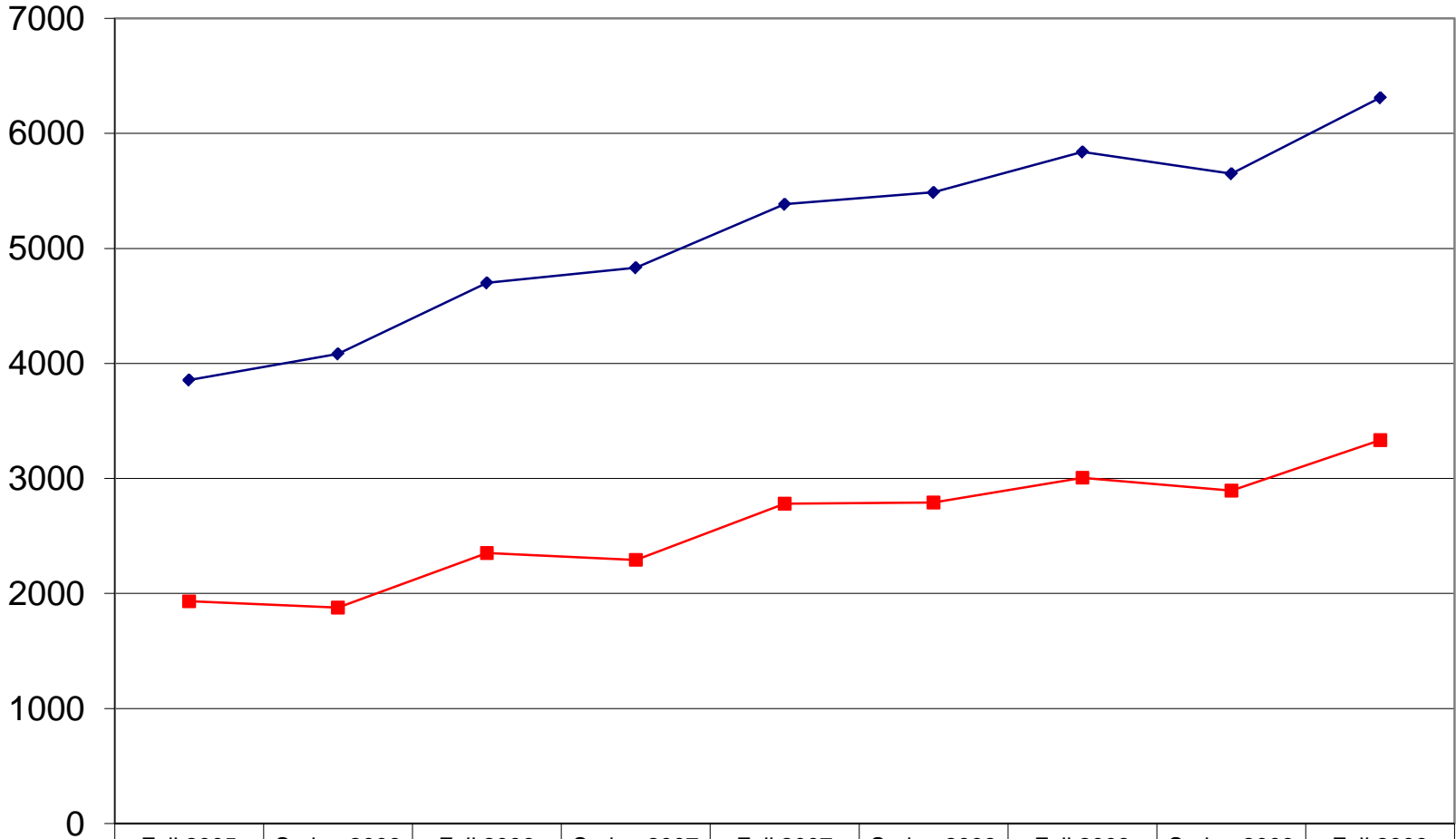

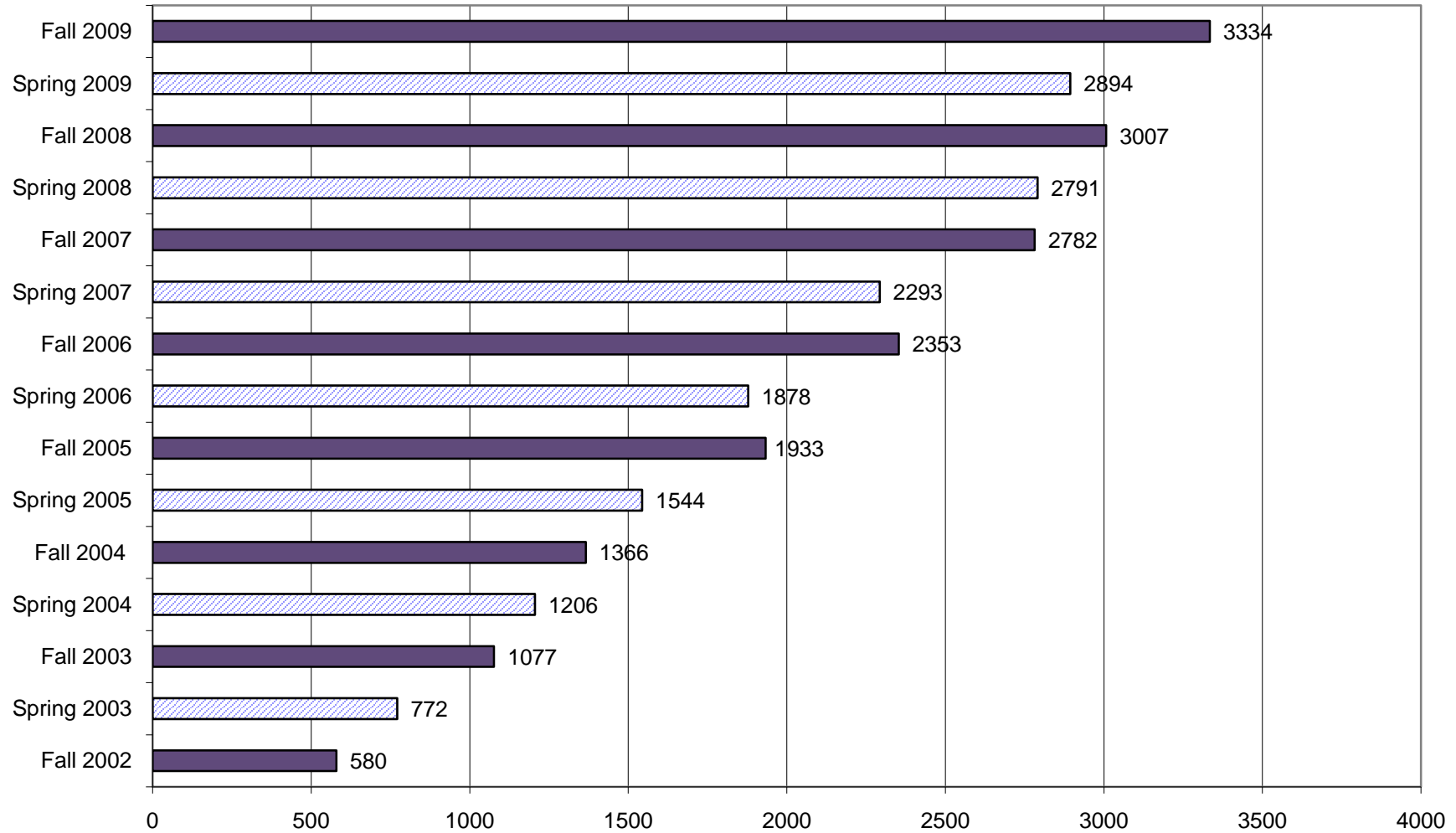

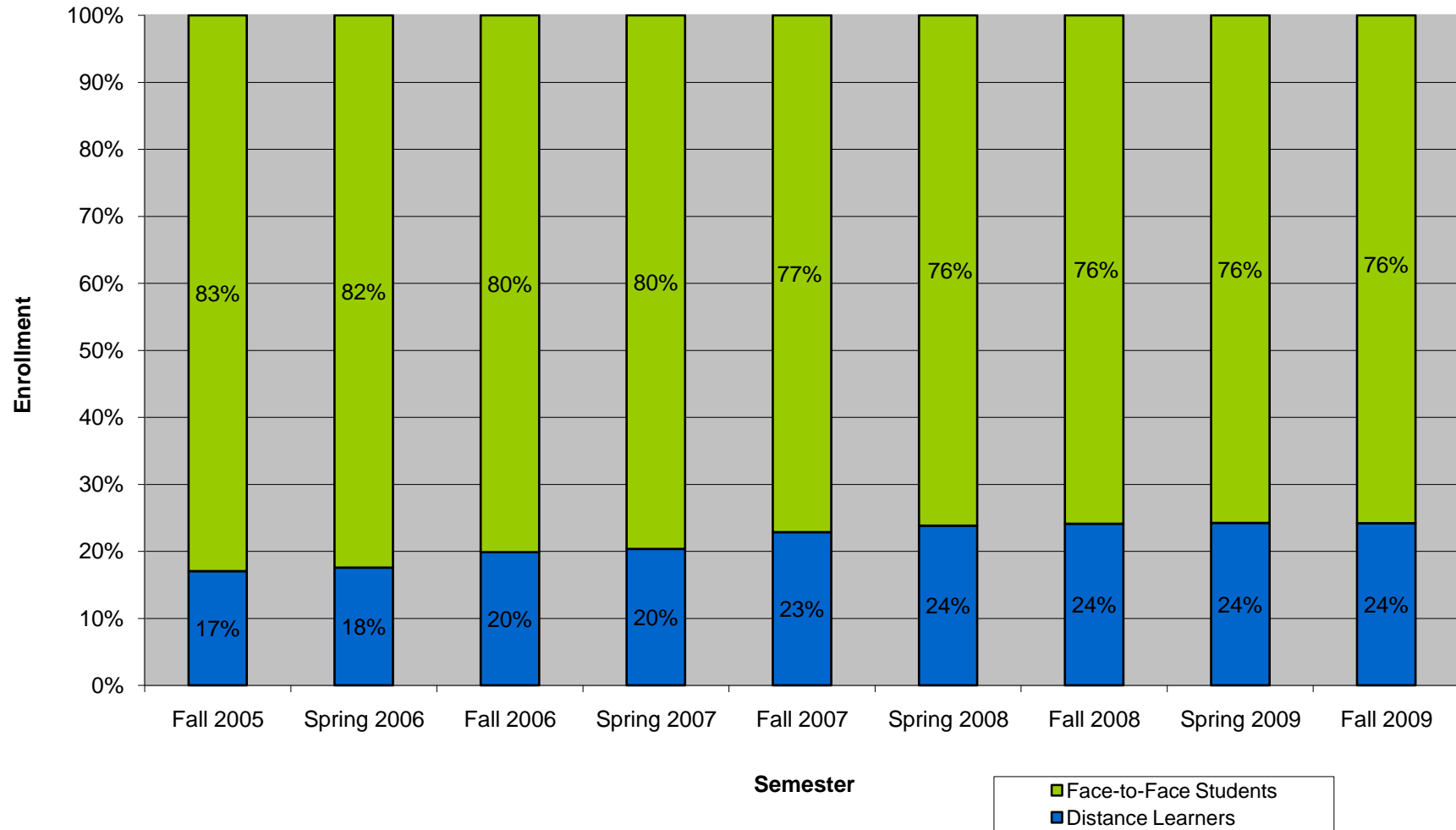

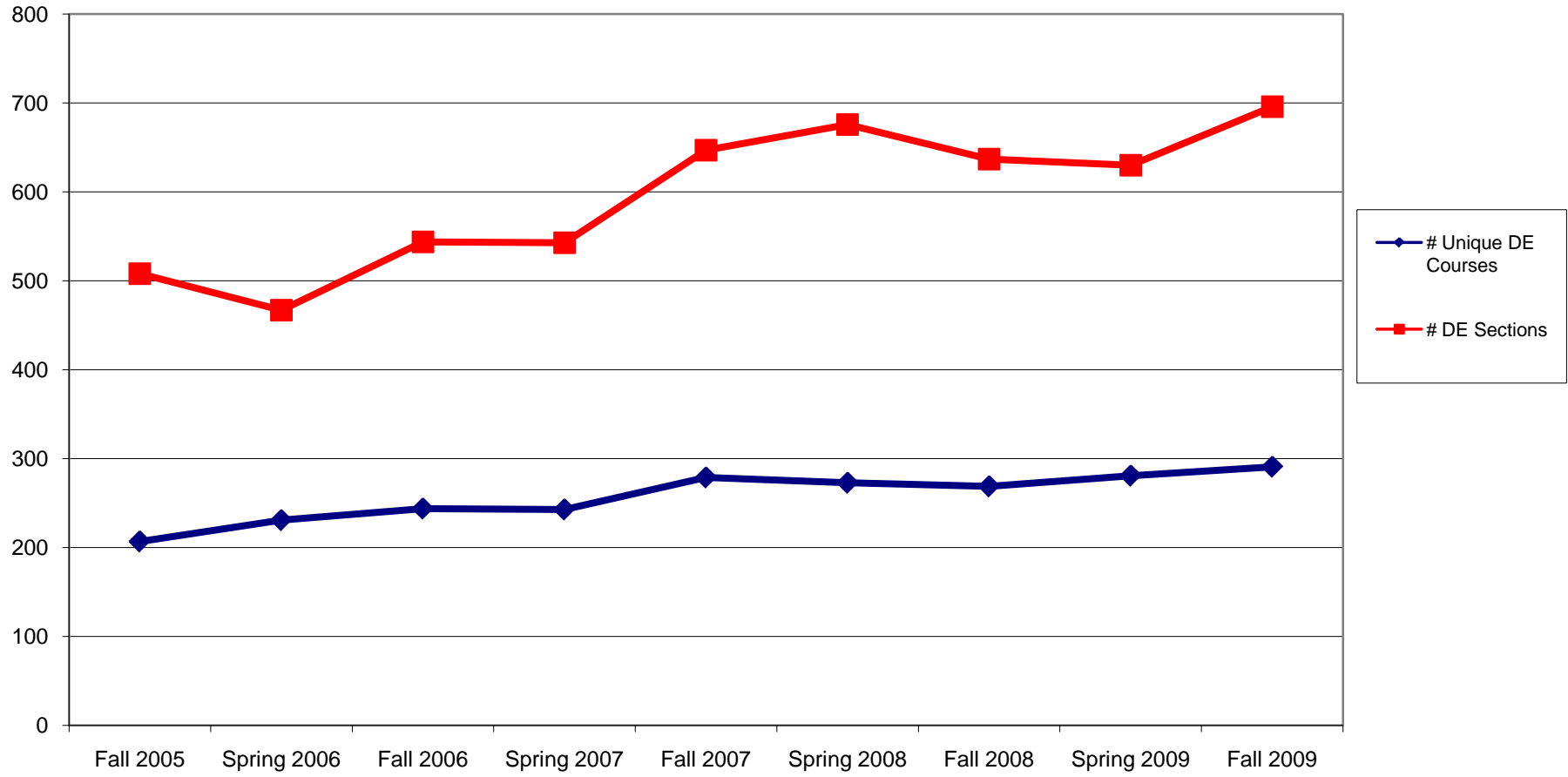
Students Taking Distance Education Classes Only



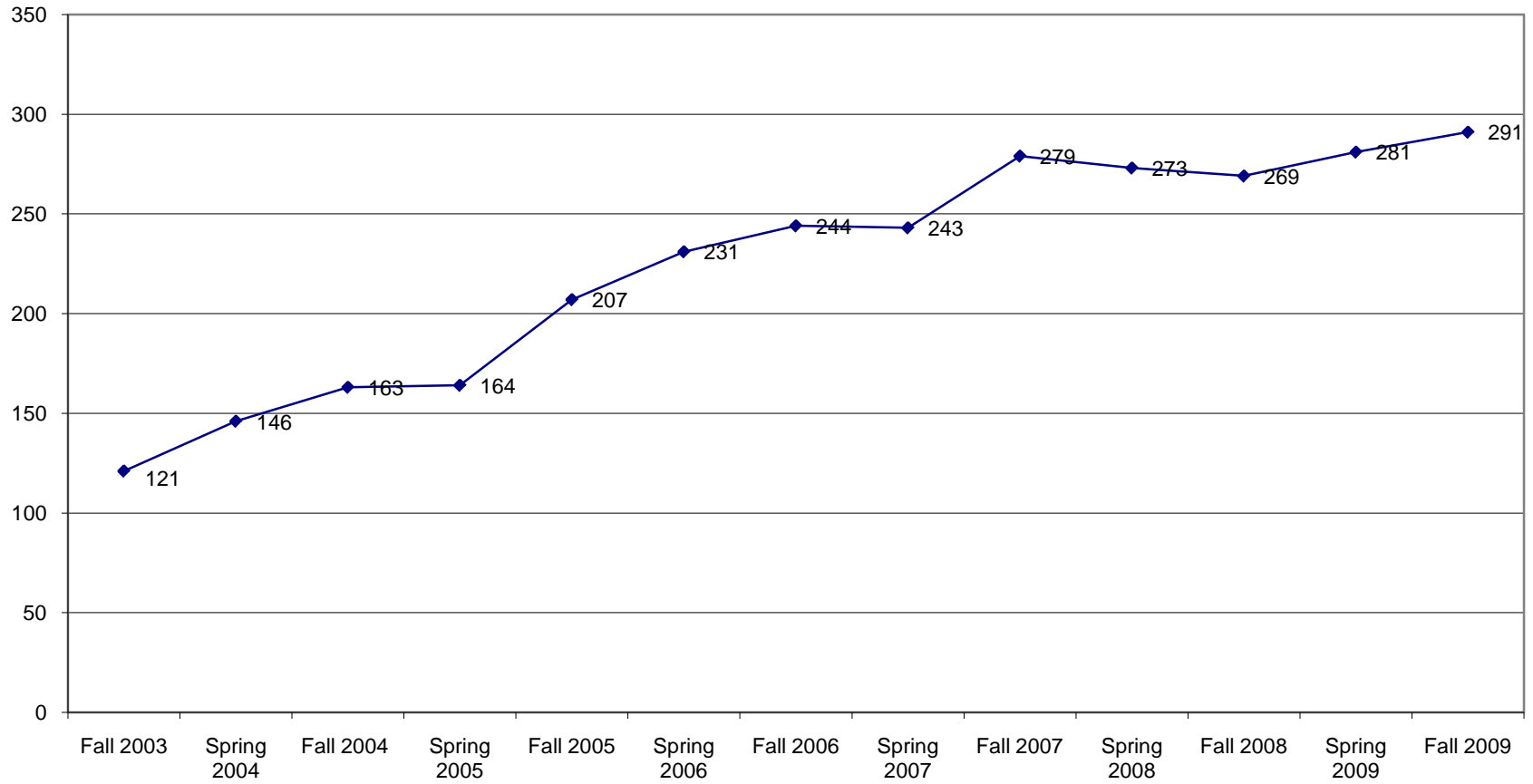
Distance Learners as % of Total Enrollment



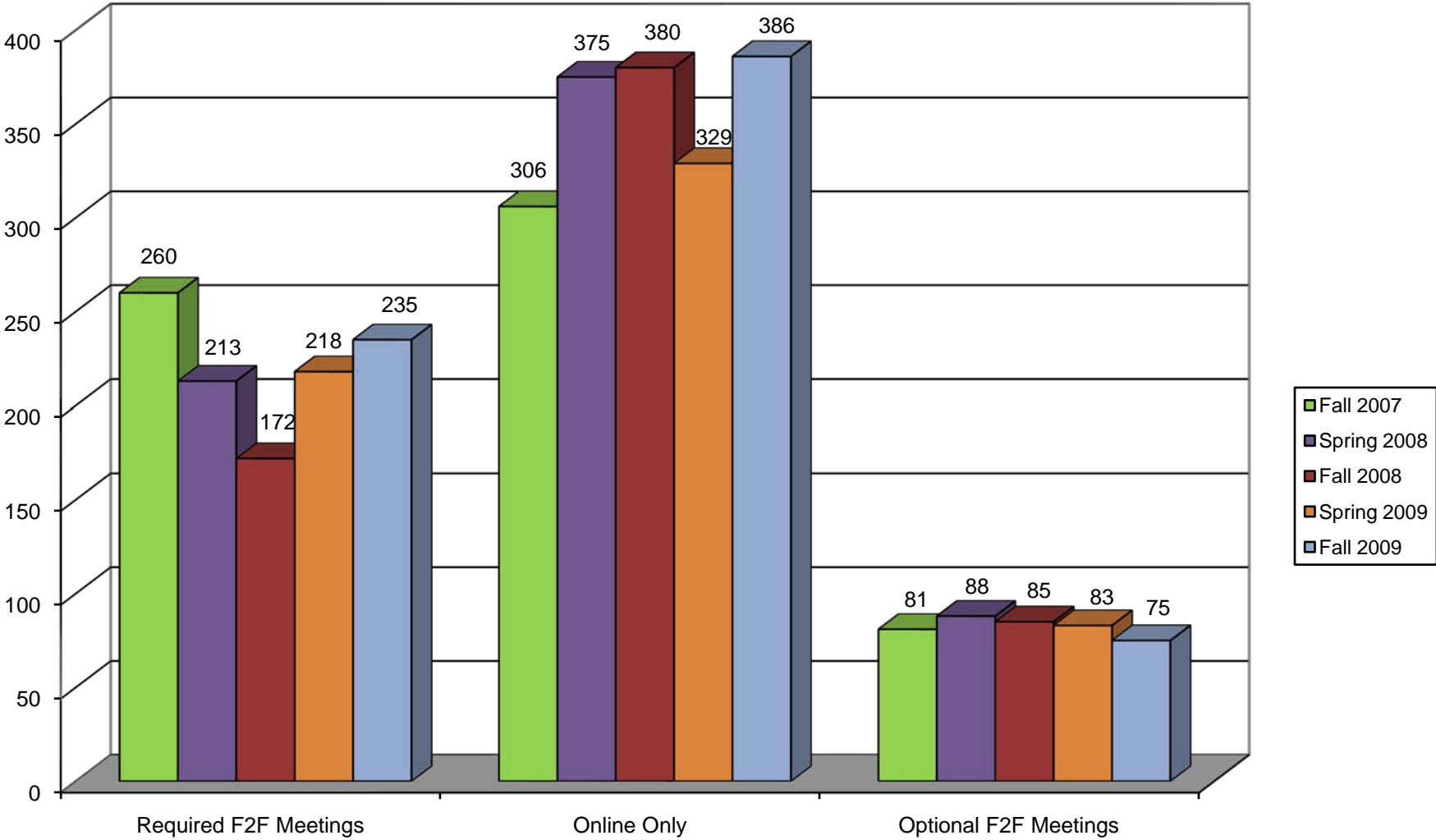
Distance Education Courses and Sections



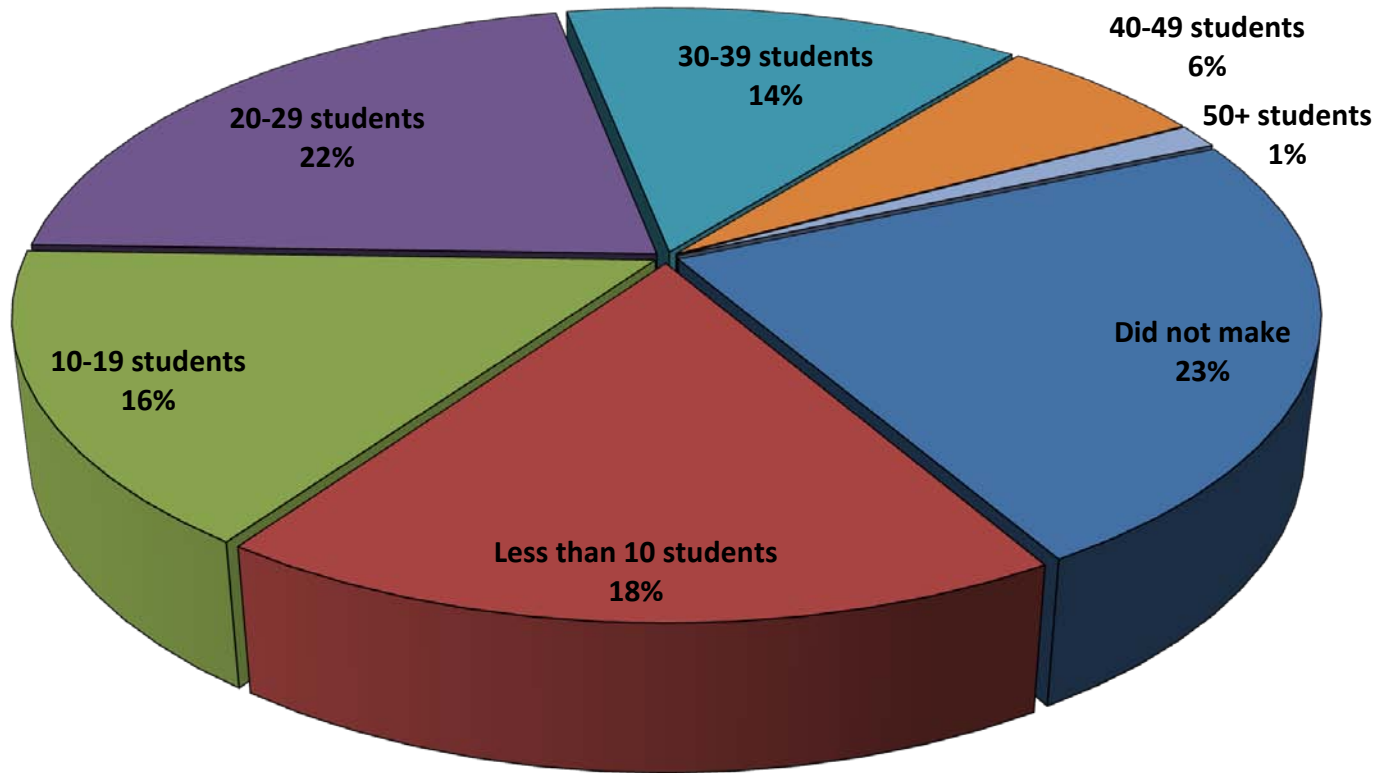
Number of Unique DE Courses at TWU



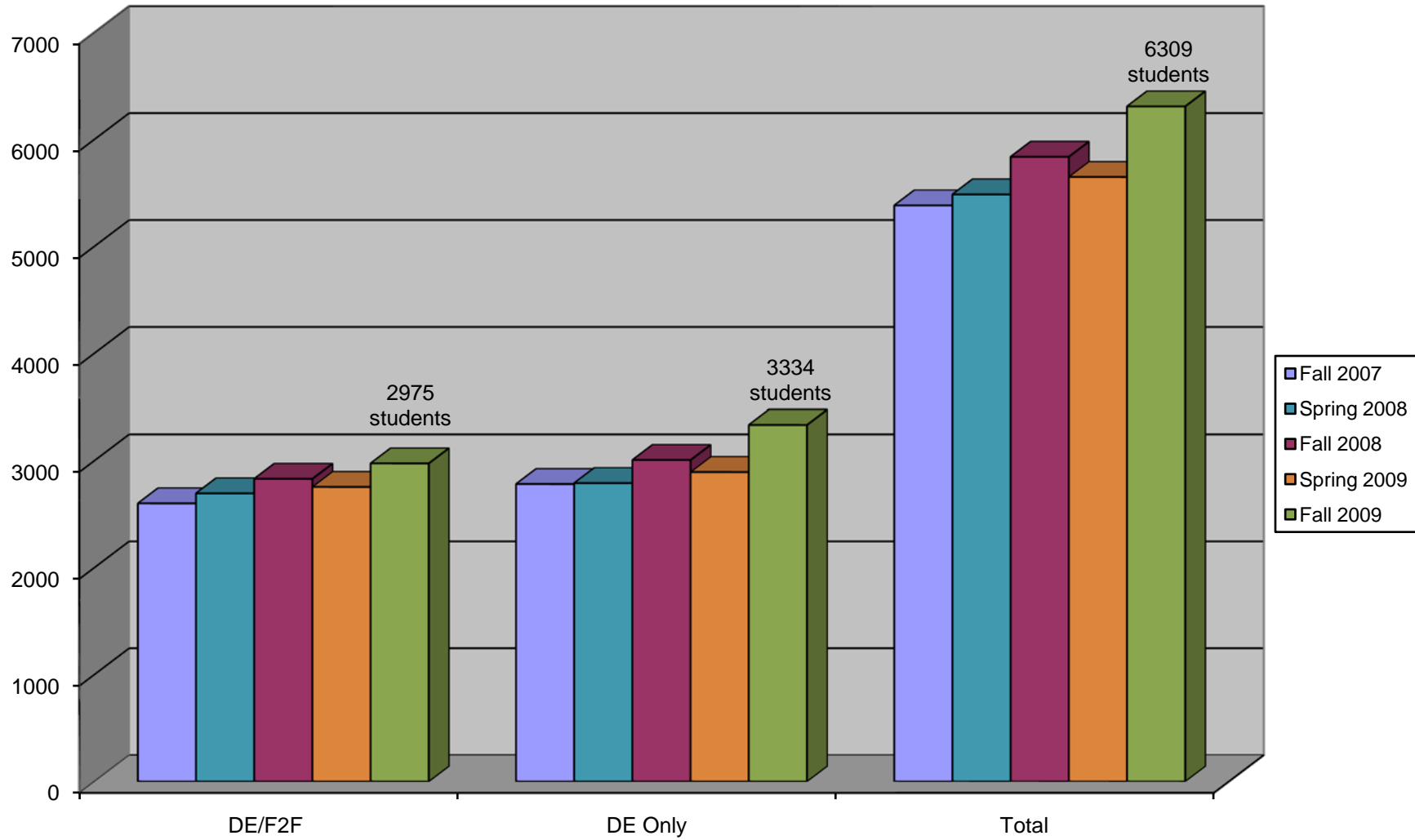
DE Sections by Instructional Method



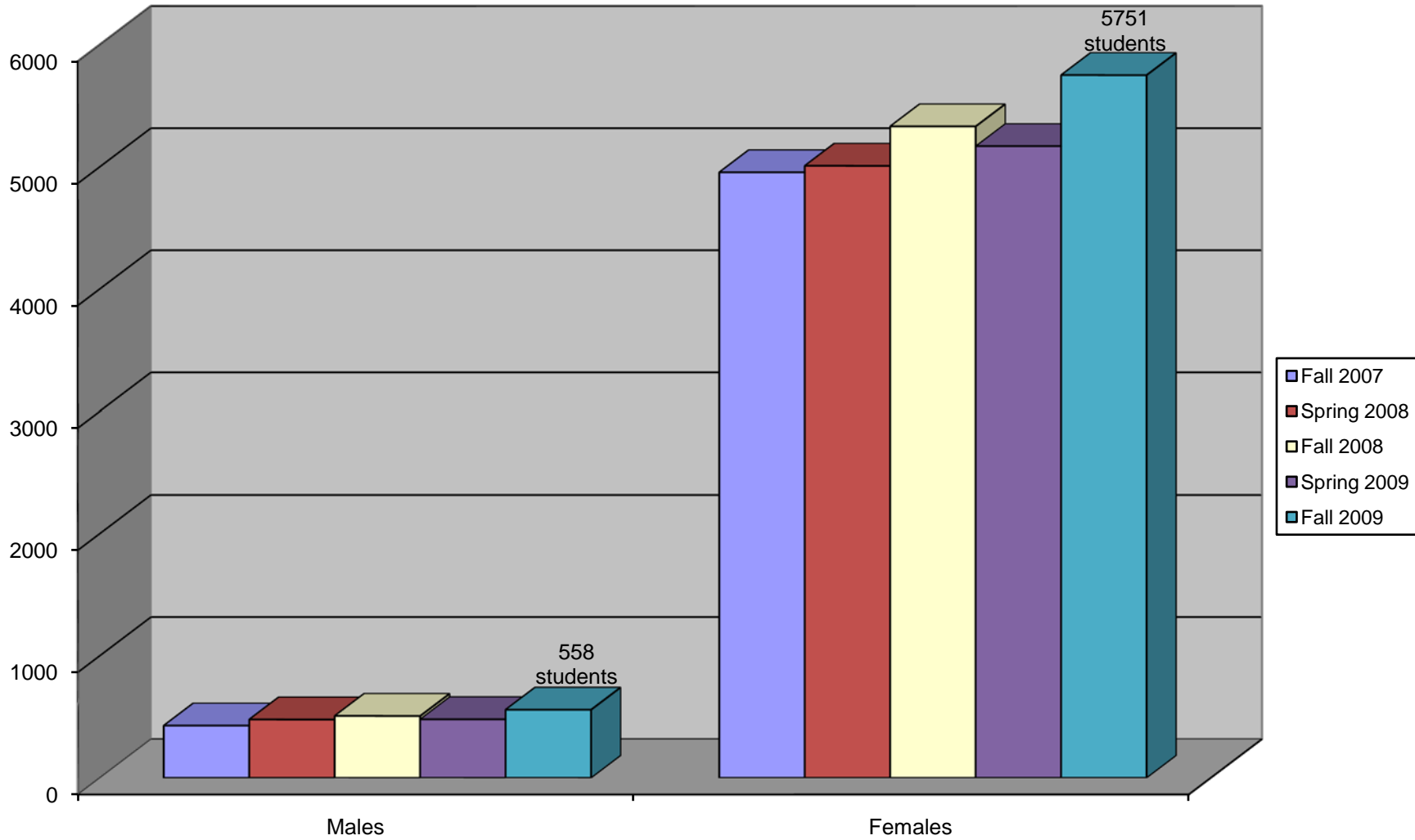
DE Section Size--Fall 2009



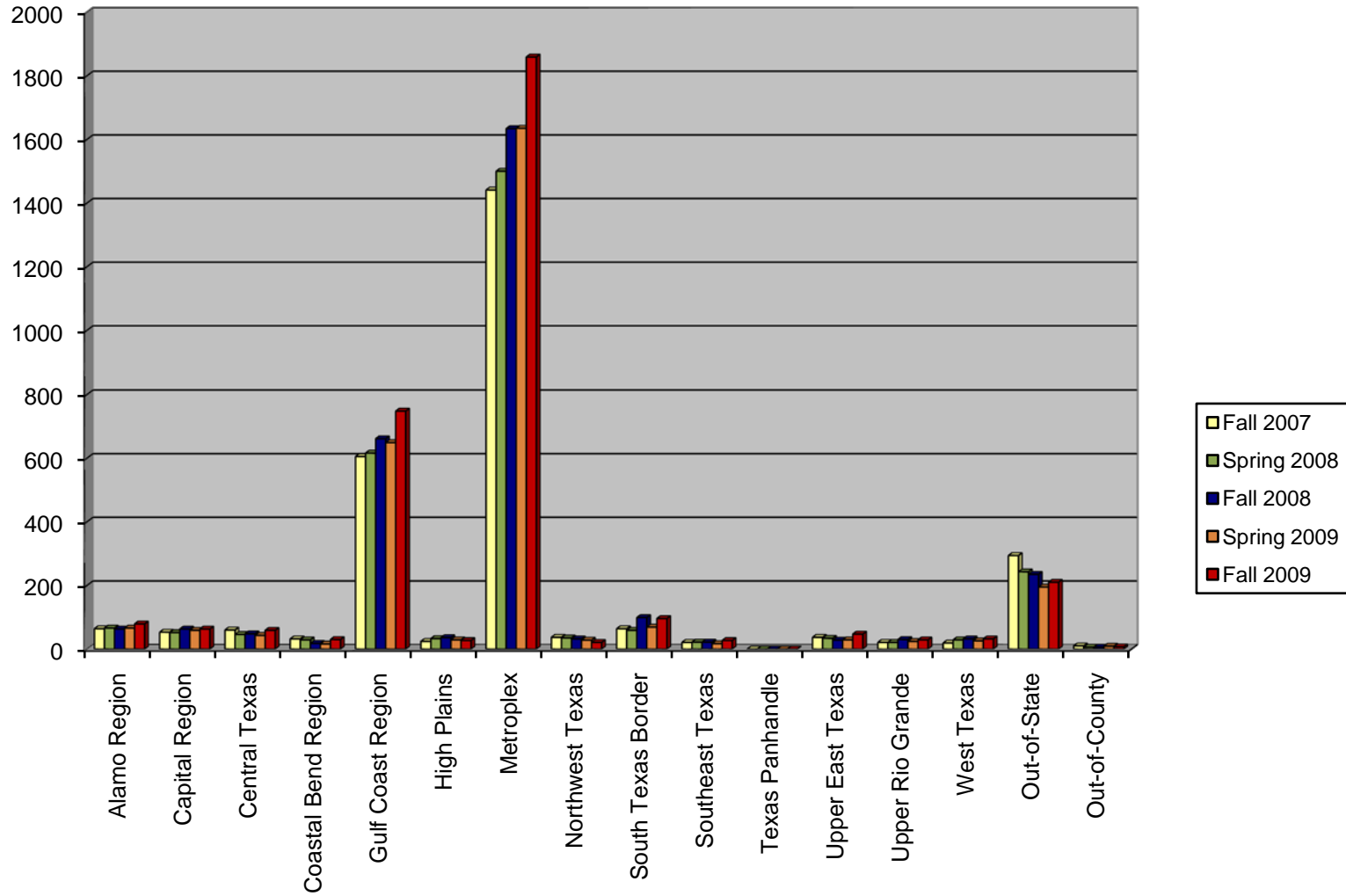
DE Enrollment by Instructional Method



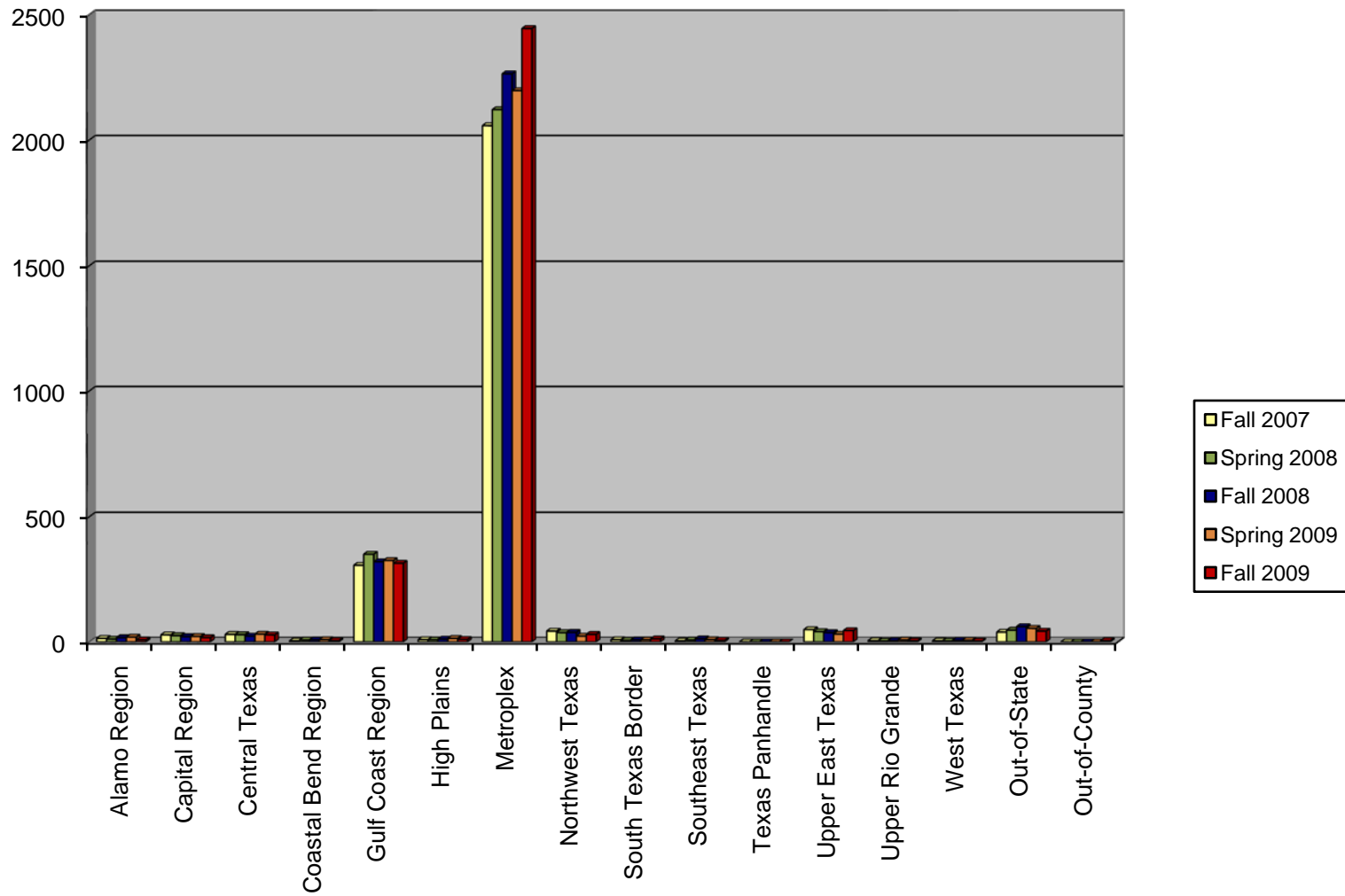
DE Enrollment by Gender



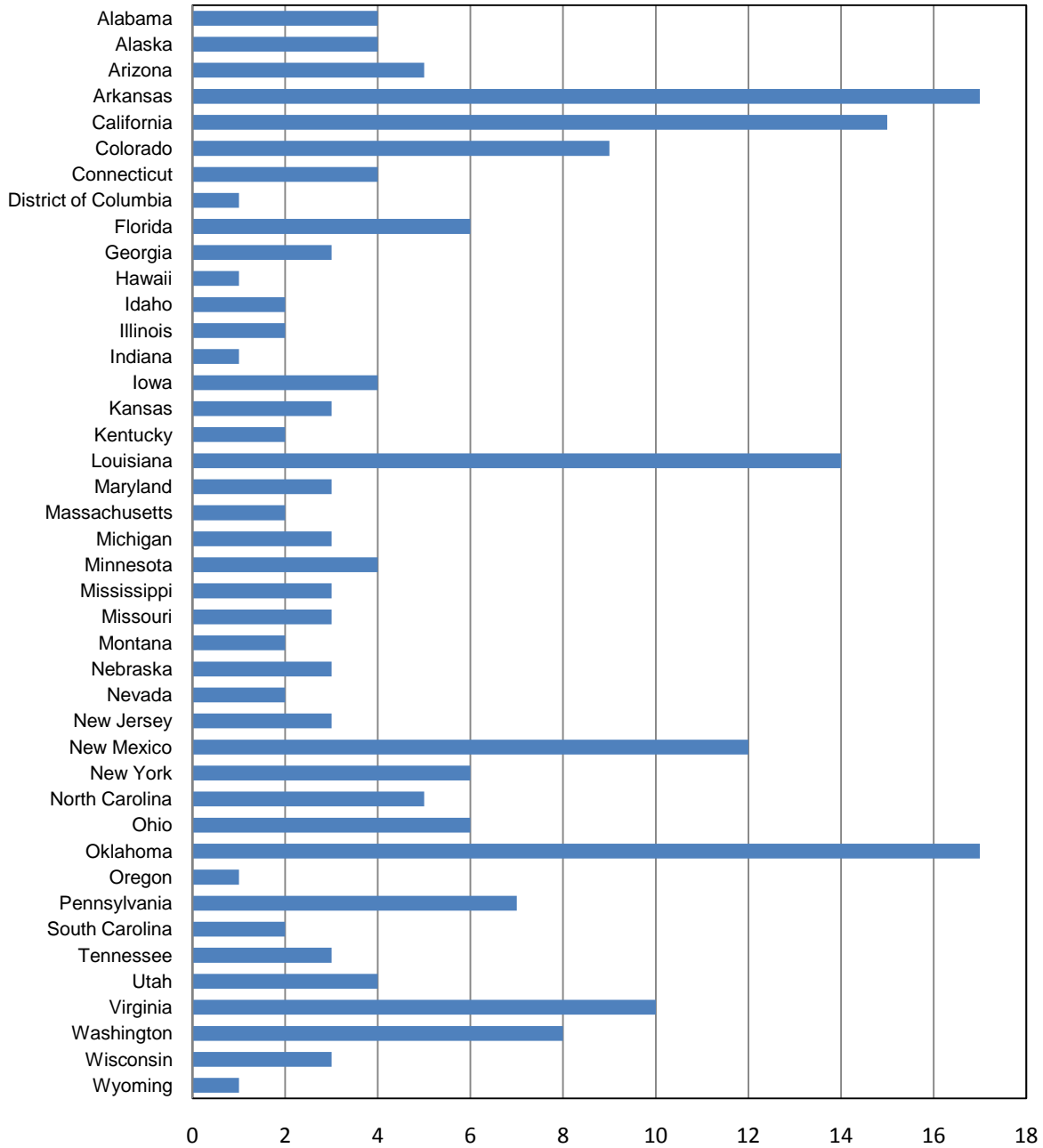
Student Enrollment by Region DE Only Students



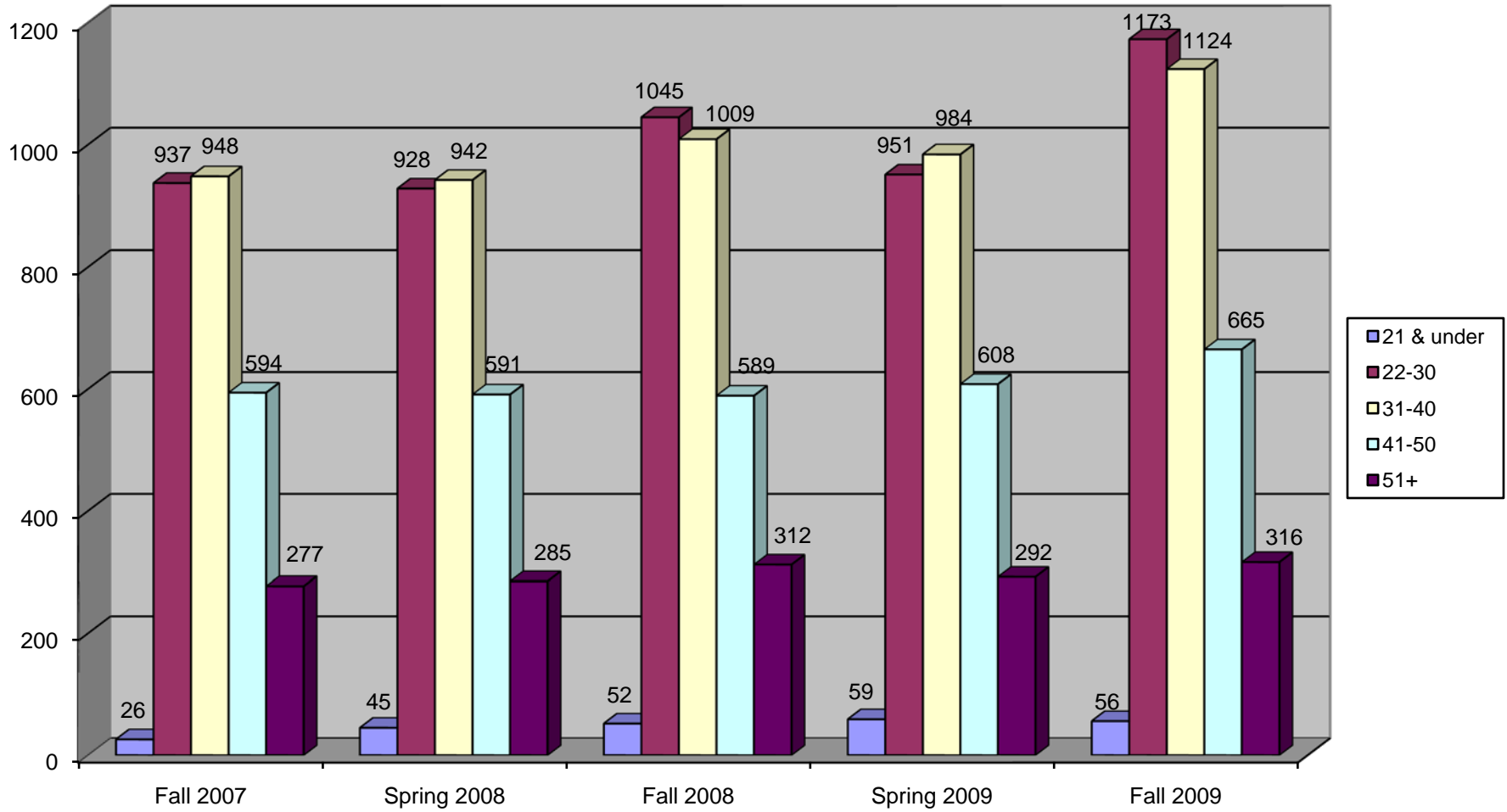
Student Enrollment by Region DE/F2F Students



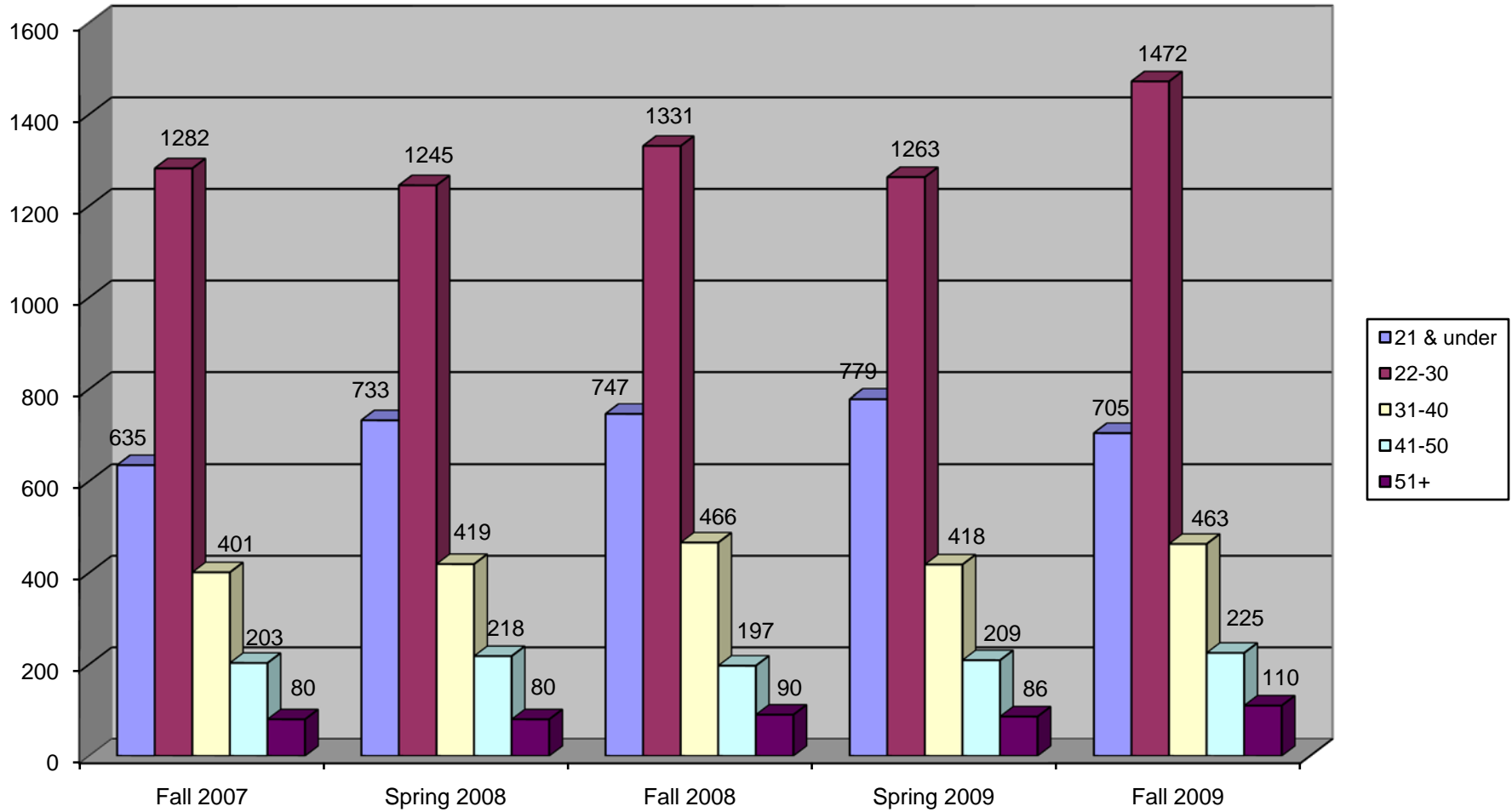
Location of DE-Only Out-of-State Students



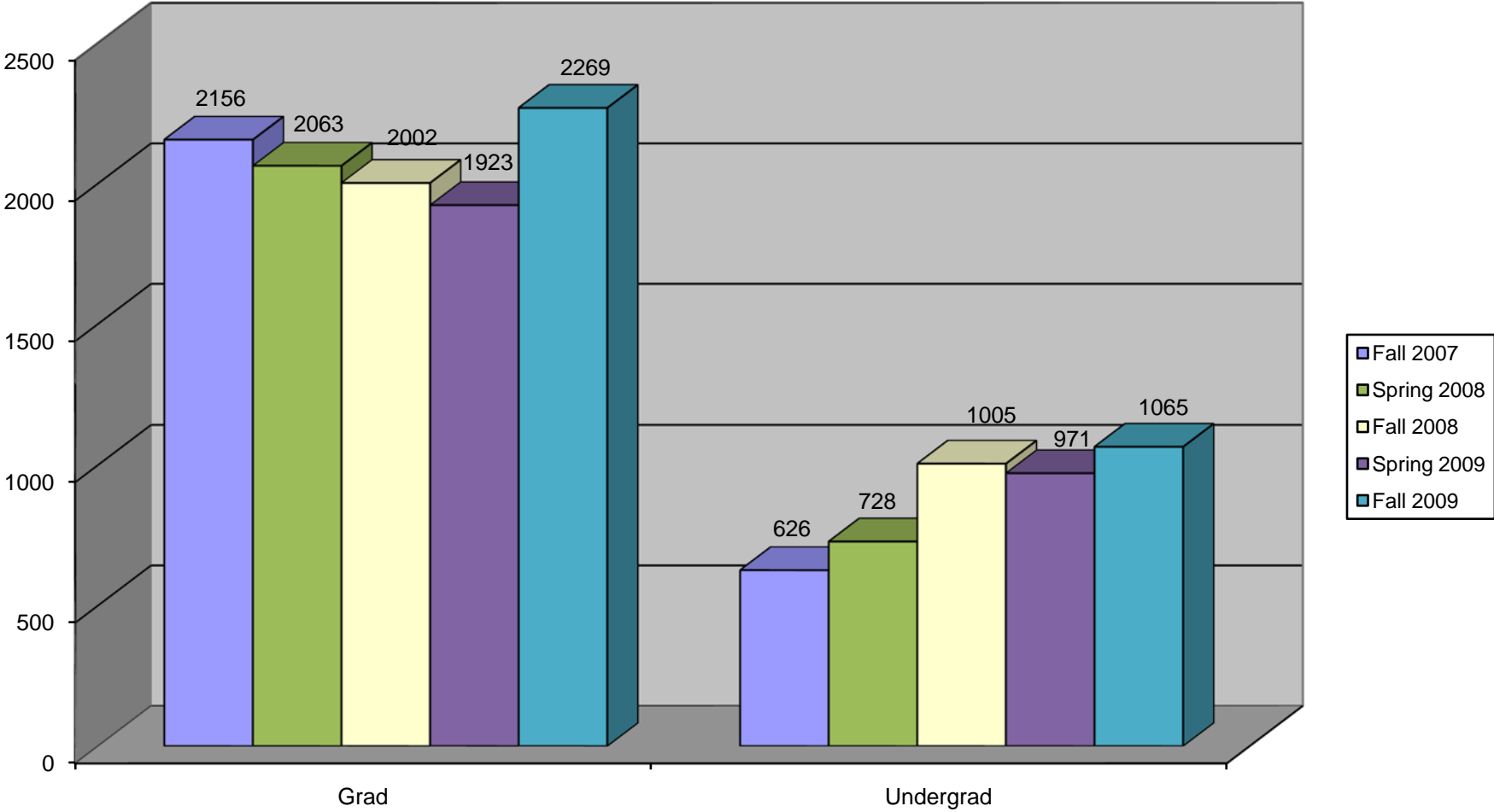
Student Enrollment by Age Range DE Only Students



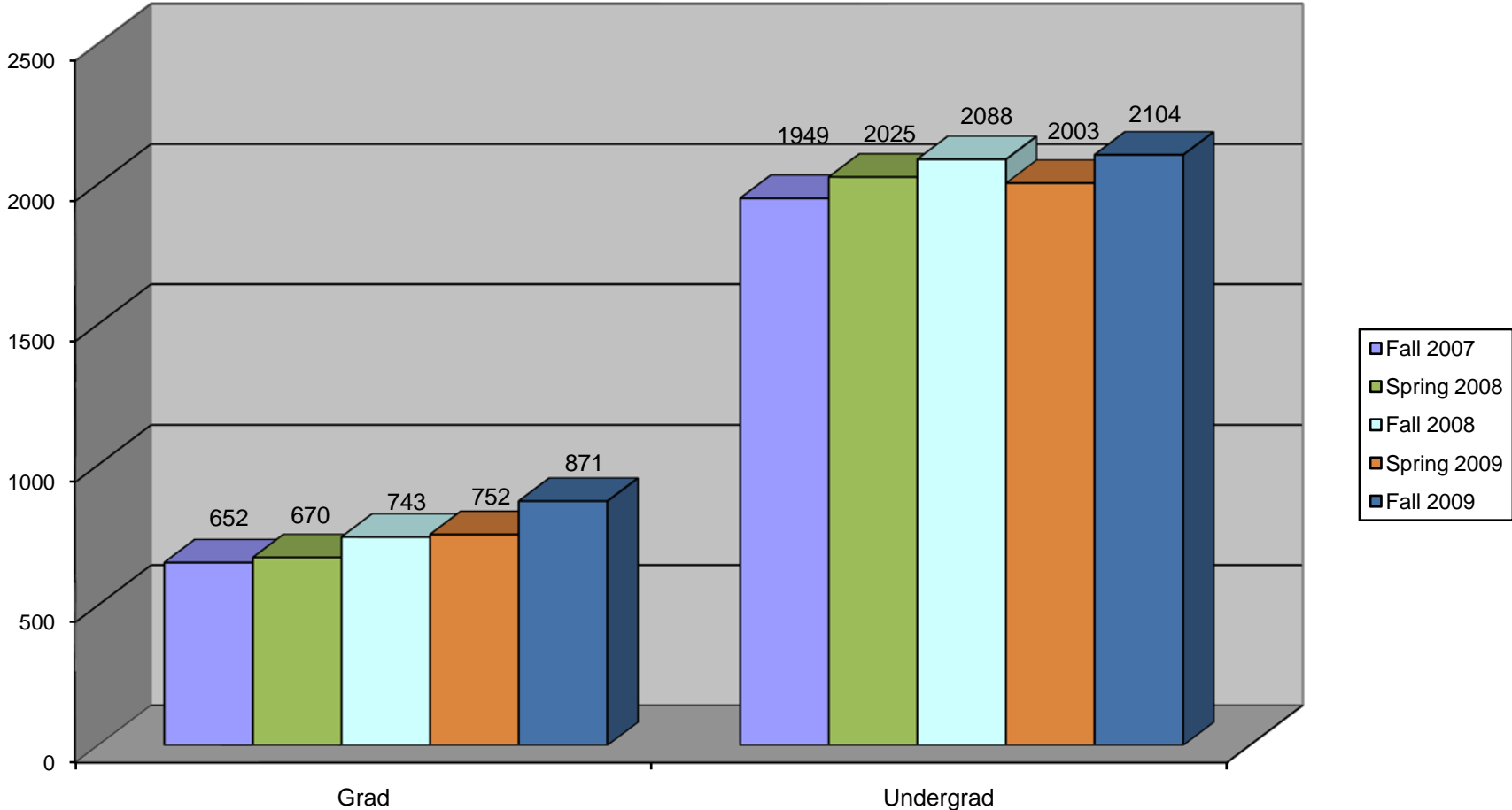
Student Enrollment by Age Range DE/F2F Students



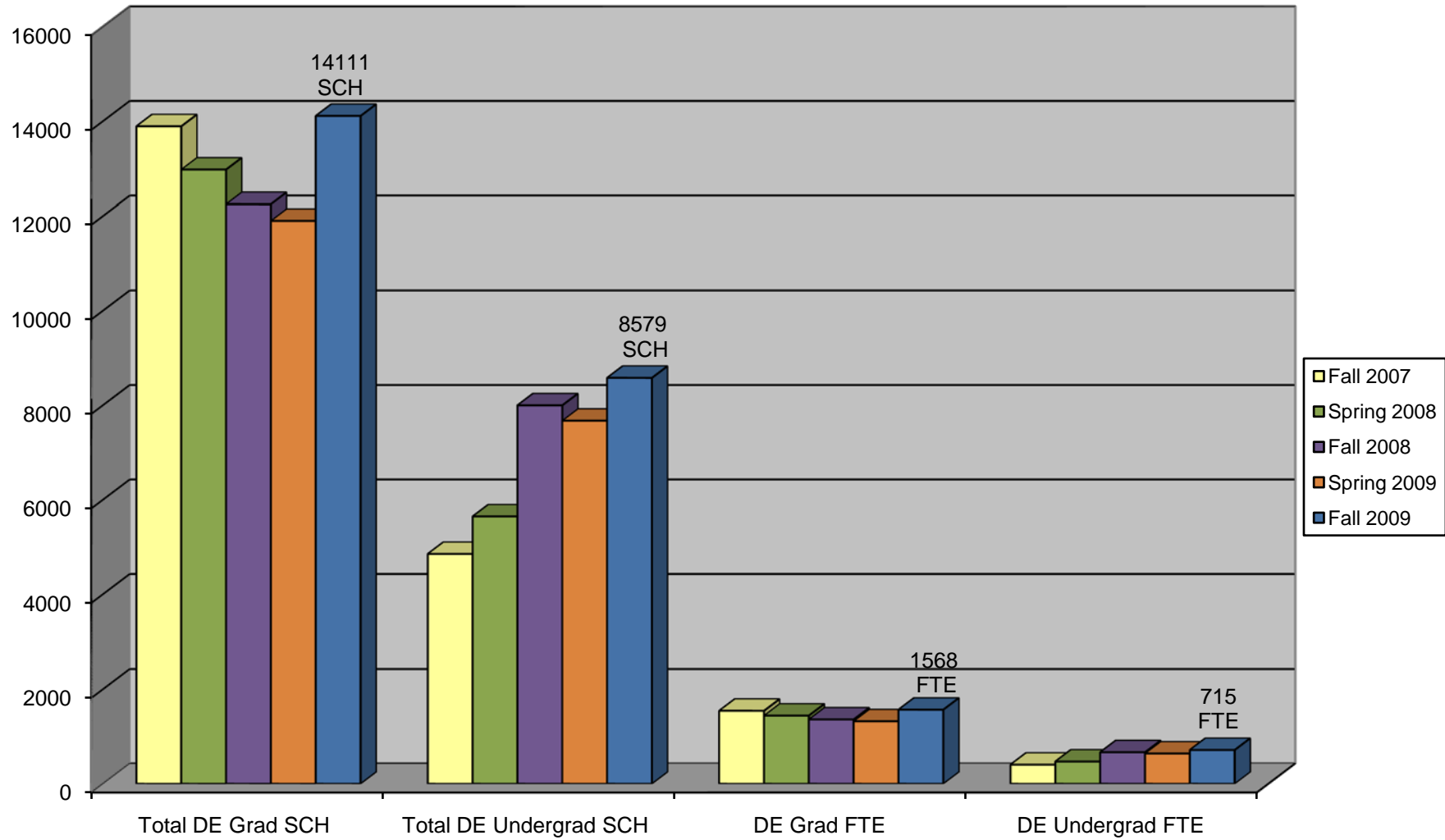
Student Enrollment by Academic Level DE Only Students



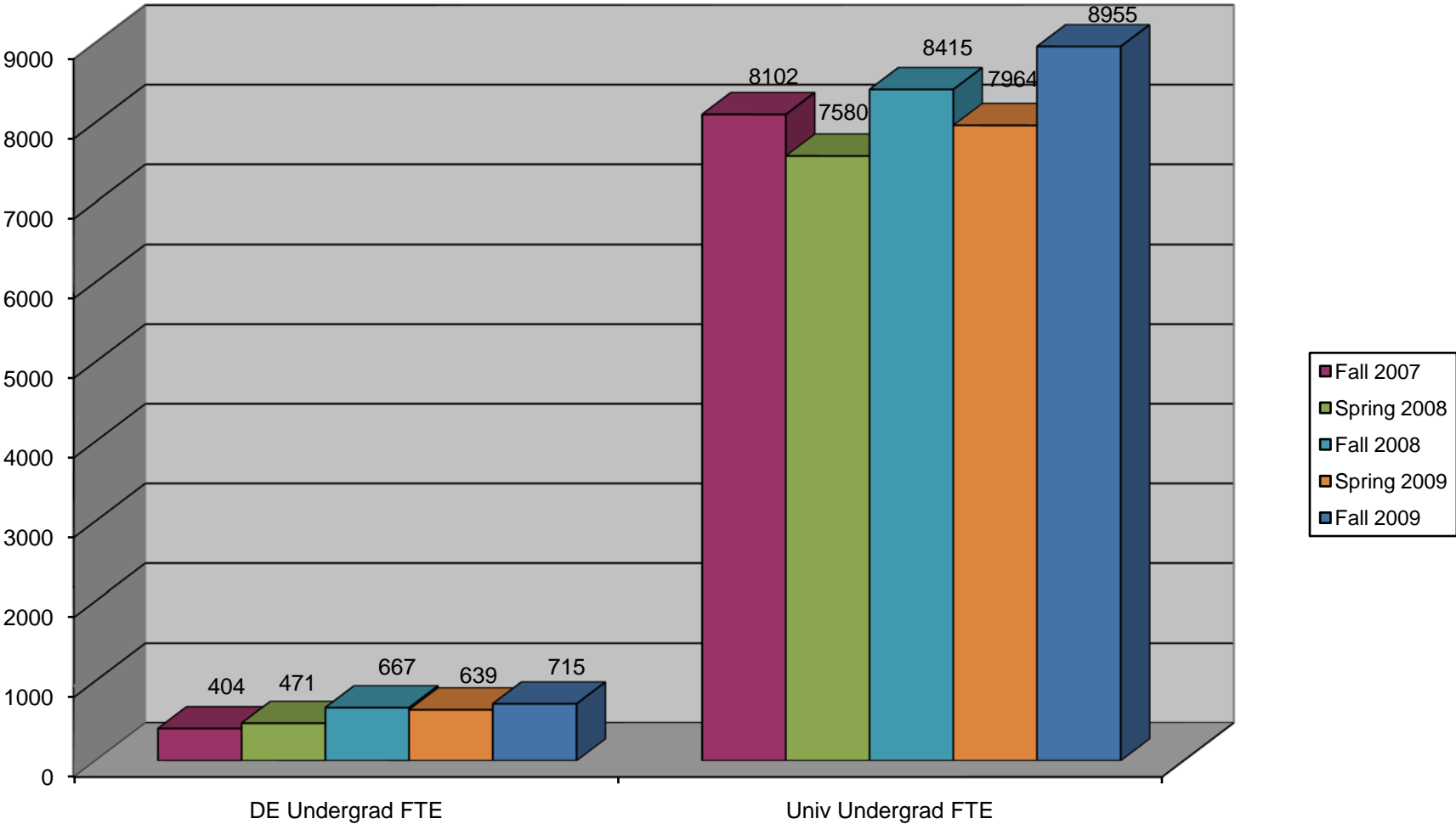
Student Enrollment by Academic Level DE/F2F Students



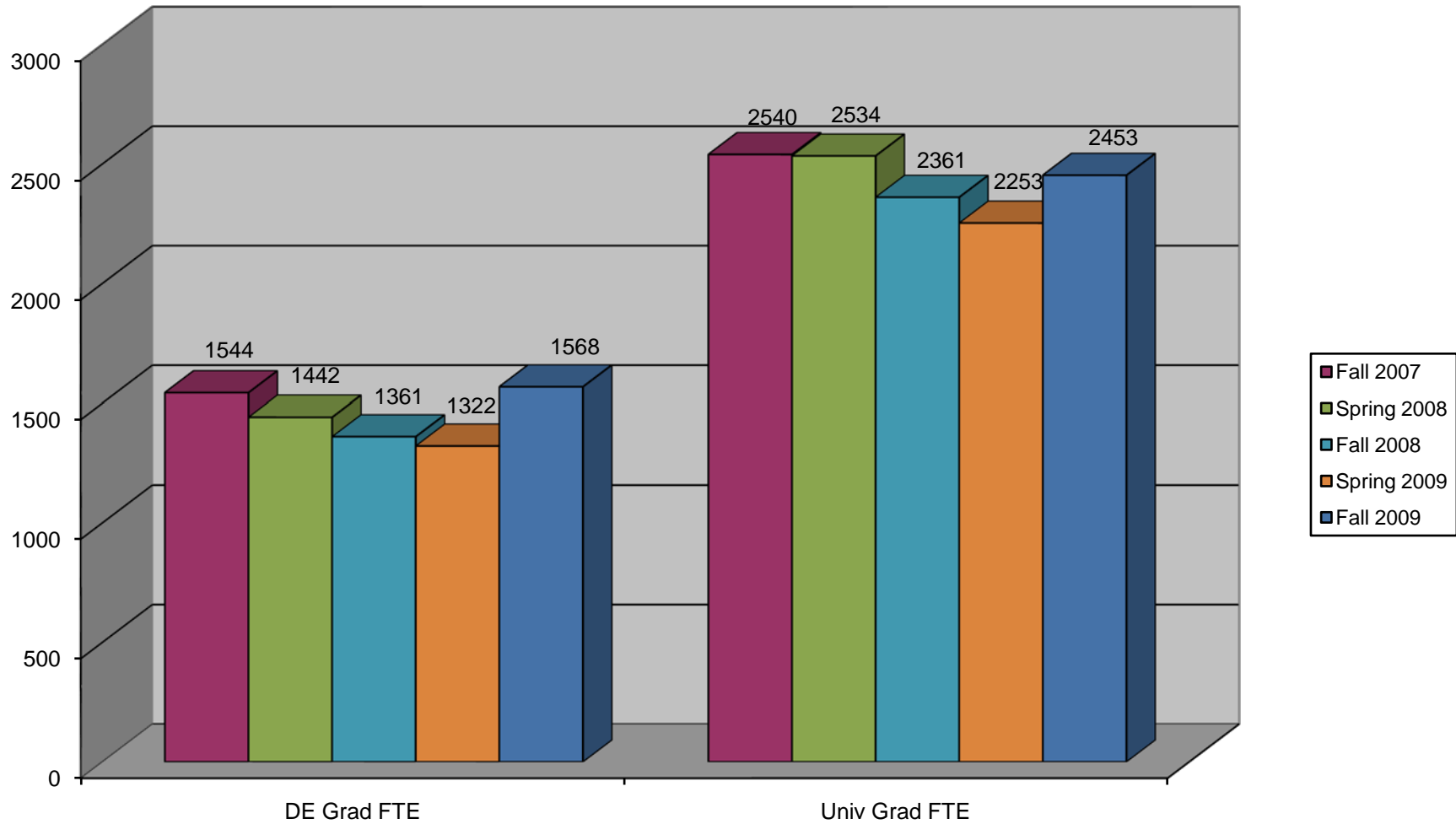

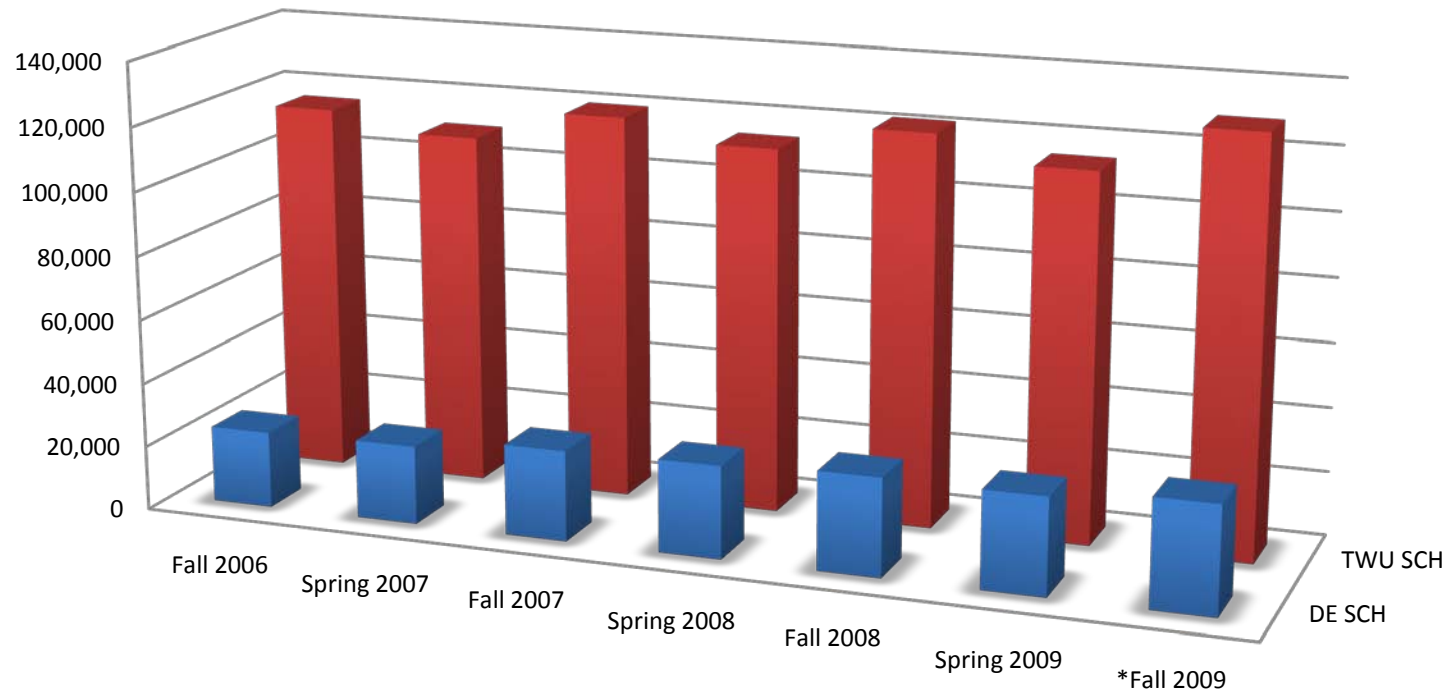

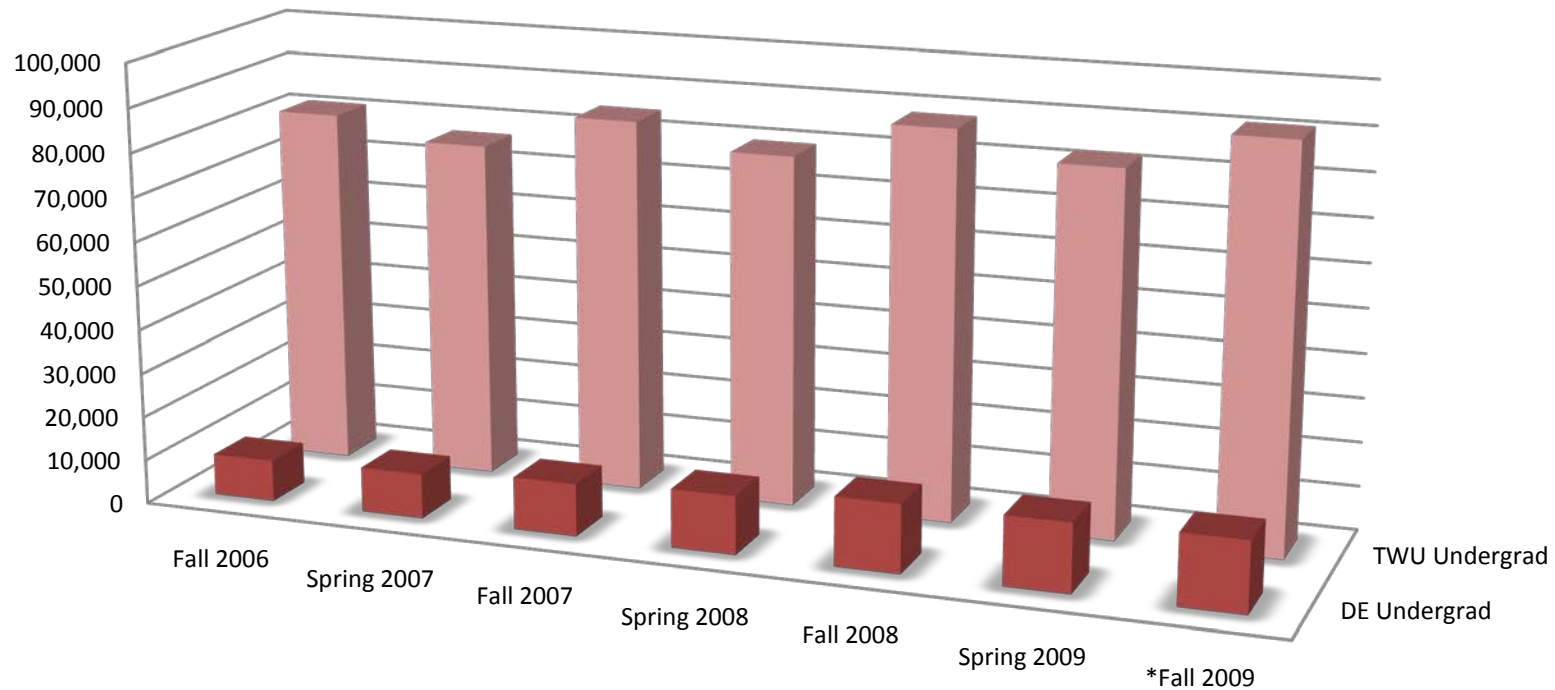

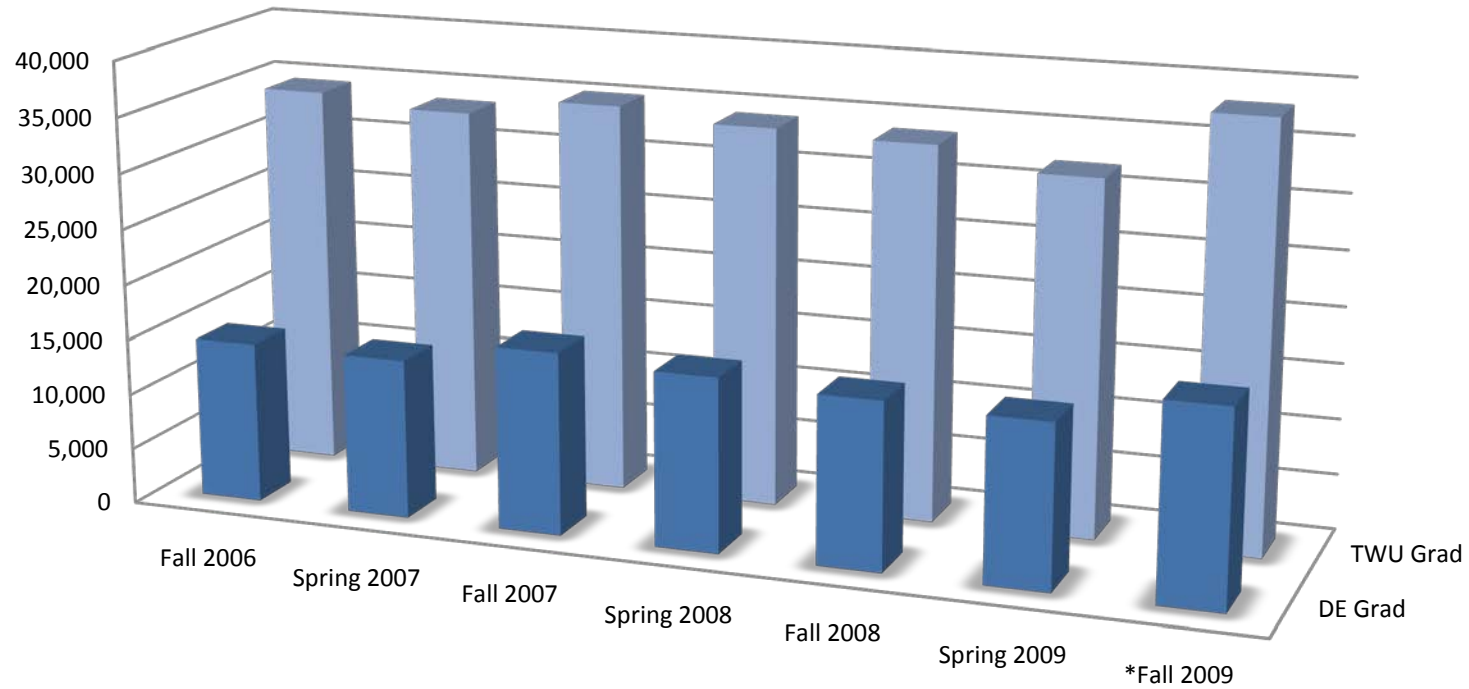
