


How to Register


All users must register before placing ILLiad document delivery/interlibrary loan requests.



Enter your TWU username and password to log into the ILLiad system and you will be prompted to set up your personal account. Please provide all required information to receive materials. Remember to update your address and delivery preferences to avoid delays.

How to Submit a Request

To place a request directly from a **database** article, use the “**Find Full Text**” option, and if no full text is available, choose “Submit Interlibrary Loan Request”.



This is available in most databases offered by the TWU Libraries. Users log in using their TWU Portal username and password to access the system.

To place a request from ILLiad, log in and select the media type from the “New Request” list. Fill in the appropriate information and click “Submit Request”.

What is ILLiad?

ILLiad is the new document delivery/interlibrary loan management system for the TWU Libraries.

ILLiad allows users to:

- Track requests
- Create a personal ILLiad account.
- Receive email notifications.
- View request history.

Why ILLiad?

There are many advantages with ILLiad:

- Users create a personal ILLiad account.
- Users can track the progress of their requests.
- Journal articles are available electronically for faster service.

What is available?

Materials available include:

- Books
- Copies of articles from journals, magazines, and newspapers, within copyright restrictions
- Government documents
- Selected conference proceedings
- Theses and dissertations

Materials unavailable include:


- Textbooks
- Materials on Reserve
- Reference books
- Rare books and other fragile or bulky items
- Entire issues of journals
- Computer software
- Audio-visual materials, sound recordings, DVDs, videos

Theses and Dissertations

Many theses and dissertations are available full-text online from the TWU Libraries databases.


To locate these databases, consult the [Databases A-Z Title List](#) and select the database to search.

- **Dissertation Abstracts Online & ProQuest Digital Dissertations**
“includes 2.4 million dissertations and theses citations from around the world from 1861 to the present day.”

- **PQDT Open**
“PQDT Open provides the full text of open access dissertations and theses free of charge. The authors of these dissertations and theses have opted to publish as open access.”

- **ETHOS**
Electronic Theses Online Service provides users with British theses online. ETHOS has over 250,000 theses and dissertations indexed with over 32,000 available for download in full text at no charge.

- **Theses Canada Portal**
Access and search the full text electronic versions of numerous Canadian theses and dissertations, as well as, Canada's national online catalog, for bibliographic records of all theses in the Library and Archives, Canada's national theses collection.

- **ADT**
Australasian Digital Theses Program provides users with Australian theses online. ADT has over 150,000 theses indexed, with over 25,000 available in full text for download at no charge.
