**MASTER'S DEGREE IN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY**

Students in the BS-MOT *FastTrack* apply to the Graduate School in the middle of their junior year. Students in the BS-MOT *FastTrack* who have met minimum requirements should apply to the School of Occupational Therapy in the fall of their junior year. The senior year is devoted to occupational therapy. The student graduates with a BS in Child Development with an emphasis in Occupational Therapy. The student completes an additional 26 credit hours of classroom courses and a supervised 6-month internship to finish the MOT degree.

\*\*\* Course applies toward 6 hrs. of global perspectives requirement, regardless of core completeness.

**PROCEDURES:**

1. The student will file TWU transcript/TWU grade reports/TWU evaluation with advisor at the time suggested by the advisor.
2. The advisor will list on this form all courses satisfactorily completed and those to be completed, by course numbers and forward to the Department Chair; if approval is granted, will forward to the minor advisor. If approval is granted the minor advisor will forward to the Dean of College.
3. The Dean will be the sole authority for authorizing substitutions in the listing of major and minor courses.
4. The Registrar's Office will determine that the legal and university-wide graduation requirements have been or will have been satisfied for graduation.
5. The Registrar's Office will notify the candidate for graduation of the steps to be followed for graduation (ordering diploma, invitations, academic regalia, time and place of ceremony).
6. The catalog carrying the date the student was first enrolled in an accredited college or university may dictate the requirements for graduation for a five-year period. Beyond this time a new catalog must be consulted. The advisor should agree on the catalog date to be used and enter this information in the space designated "Catalog Date" on the opposite side of this form.

**NOTES:**

1. By state law the candidate must have credit for six (6) semester hours of American History. Texas History may substitute for three (3) semester hours.
2. By state law the candidate must have credit for six (6) semester hours of federal and state constitutions. ROTC credit at a senior institution may be substituted.
3. Majors: Majors are defined as a minimum of thirty (30) semester hours. One-half (1/2) of these hours must be advanced. A minimum of 36 advanced hours is required for any baccalaureate degree.
4. Minors: Most minors at Texas Woman's University include a minimum of eighteen (18) hours. A minor included a minimum of 6 credit hours at the advanced level. Students should consider the state excess hours rule when considering earning a minor.
5. At least one-half (1/2) of the upper level courses in the major and at least one-half of the upper level courses in the minor must be completed at TWU.
6. A minimum of 25% of the credit hours must be taken at TWU. Correspondence and credit-by-examination courses do not satisfy residence requirements for graduation.
7. A student who holds a valid bachelor's degree from another accredited college or university and who wishes to earn a second bachelor's degree at TWU must complete the following legal requirements: Six (6) semester hours of American History, six (6) semester hours of national and state governments, and thirty-six (36) semester hours of advanced studies, and meet departmental and residential requirements.
8. Students may transfer no more than 72 semester hours from junior or community colleges. There is no limit for transfer credit from senior institutions.
9. Candidates for Teacher Certification may need to file a separate degree plan designated strictly for teacher certification.
