MASTER'S DEGREE IN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY
 Students in the BS-MOT *FastTrack* apply to the Graduate School in the middle of their junior year. Students in the BS-MOT *FastTrack* who have met minimum requirements should apply to the School of Occupational Therapy in the fall of their junior year. For students accepted, the senior year is devoted to occupational therapy. The student graduates with a BS in Family Studies with an emphasis in Occupational Therapy. The student completes an additional 26 credit hours of classroom courses and a supervised 6-month internship to finish the MOT degree.
