



## FACT SHEET

Did you know 75% of your time at the University is spent outside the classroom? A majority time is spent where you reside if you are living on-campus, or split between commuting and where you reside if you live off-campus.

Your living environment is an integral component for your success at the University. This is why our residence halls are equipped to provide you much more than just a place to sleep. They are "living/learning environments" where you have the opportunity to interact with a variety of people from a wide range of backgrounds, participate in various activities in and outside of the halls, and become a leader through your involvement in student organizations and/or student employment positions. Through these experiences you learn more about yourself as your university education inside and outside the classroom prepares you for your career and your future.

### HOUSING SERVICES

- Rooms with private and semi-private bathrooms
- Campus apartments - suites, one, two, and three bedrooms
- Family housing for students with children and/or spouses
- Guest housing, for short term stays on campus, (for visiting parents, etc.)
- Special interest housing is available for graduate and non-traditional students, sorority housing, international experience floors, honors/scholars floor, and residential learning communities
- Room refrigerators provided at no additional charge
- Local telephone service provided at no additional charge
- Denton extended calling service reaches most phone numbers in the 817, 972, 214 and 940 area codes at no additional charge. All other calls are subject to long distance charges.
- Basic TV cable hook up in each resident's room at no extra charge
- Computer labs equipped with PCs and printers / Internet access
- Laundry rooms in each building, with card access for washers and dryers
- Air-conditioned residence halls
- Big Screen TVs in the lobbies
- Games and recreation equipment available at each front desk
- Snack and soft drink machines
- Snack kitchens equipped with microwave ovens as well as one kitchen per building with stove and refrigerator
- Terrific staff to assist you
- On-campus security
- Clubhouse after school and summer recreation program for school-age children of TWU students
- In room high-speed computer connections in all buildings. (Resnet)

## **RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT AND COMMUTERS**

The University requires all full-time, single undergraduates who have not completed 60 credit hours, who are under the age of 21, and who are not veterans of military service, or living with parents or legal guardians within commuting distance, live in University residence halls.

If you are commuting from home and are under the residency requirement, you must complete a "Certification of Living With Parents" form. Your parents must sign the form also, and it must be notarized. You may mail the completed form to TWU University Housing, Box 425380, Denton, Texas 76204-5380, or bring it to the housing office in Jones Hall before you register. You will not be able to register for full-time classes until this form has been received and processed in the housing office. Of course, we hope you decide to live on-campus and get involved in residence life! If not, we offer commuter housing for times you need to work late on that term paper or study for that big test! You can spend up to three nights in any given week in the residence halls, but make your reservations at least one week in advance at 940.898.3676. Prepayment is required to hold your reservation. We do accept credit cards for your convenience.

## **LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES**

### **VOLUNTEER**

We encourage you to get involved in one or more of the student organizations in the residence halls. The residence halls are represented by their individual residence hall government and councils. The family housing council represents all of the families residing in the family housing apartments at Lowry Woods. In addition to the individual hall governments, the umbrella organization for the residence hall students is the Residence Hall Association (RHA). The RHA is involved in policy recommendation and program planning and implementation.

Two other important groups are the Housing Advisory Board and the Food Advisory Board. These are comprised of both on-campus and off-campus students and faculty who provide valuable input to both the University Housing and Food Services.

### **EMPLOYMENT**

There are a number of student positions available through University Housing, all of which are all very important for the successful operation of the residence halls.
