## Texas Woman’s University Living Learning Communities

Living Learning Communities (LLC) at Texas Woman’s University provide student learning opportunities outside the classroom that strengthen student intellectual and personal growth. Designed to integrate curricular and co-curricular experiences, they complement and extend classroom learning by fostering faculty and resident interaction enhancing the intellectual and personal development of the residents. Each community’s unique features are structured so that students have a high degree of involvement in the programs.

Upper-class students, who are LLC alumni, serve as Resident Assistants (RA) and Peer Advisors (PA) for each community. The RA and PA live on the floors with the students and provide valuable resources and assistance with the transition to college life.

### Application Process

To participate in a Living Learning Community you must:

- ▶ Be admitted to TWU
- ▶ Return your housing application and pay your \$125 housing deposit and application fee
- ▶ Complete the Living Learning Community application and return it to housing by June 1
- ▶ If accepted the \$50 Learning Community Fee will be billed to your student account
- ▶ You may only be enrolled in one (1) Living Learning Community

### Neighbors Educated Together

Neighbors Educated Together (NET) offers first year students the opportunity to take as a group courses required for graduation, while residing in a clustered living environment in the residence hall. Students participating in NET live in Stark Hall and on two floors in Guinn Hall. Your roommate must also be in the NET program and will be registered for the same NET courses.

#### Unique Community Features:

- ▶ Enroll as a group in Freshman English or Math, History and UNIV 1011 together your first semester



- ▶ Take Freshman English, History and Sociology or Women’s Studies your second semester
- ▶ Study groups with your neighbors
- ▶ Field trips
- ▶ Honors NET courses: World Civilizations, Mythology, UNIV 1011, Sociology, World Literature
- ▶ Peer Advisors and Resident Assistants to guide and support you

### First Year Connections

First Year Connections is developed around the special interest themes of wellness and leadership.

#### Wellness Connection

The Wellness Connection community is focused on providing a healthy and holistic approach to college life. It’s about making positive lifestyle choices during your transition into college. The Wellness Connection philosophy supports the premise that there are healthy ways of living, and empowers students to take control over the quality of their life. Placing emphasis on the six dimensions of wellness (physical, emotional, spiritual, intellectual, occupational, social), the program encourages students to make choices that will help them develop a more centered, balanced lifestyle.
