The theme of Miss Foster's administration was "Unity of Purpose" which recognized the difficulties and challenges that the Federation would face during World War II. Various programs of war work were established during Miss Foster's administration including: promotion of nursing programs, the sale of war bonds and stamps, gowns for British brides, the silk hose project and warm clothes drives for victim relief. The Foster administration passed resolutions expressing support for women employed in the war industry and day care for working mothers. The Federation also aided in the recruitment of WAC's.
