During Mrs. Johnson's administration the federation urged the state to appropriate funds that were urgently needed by the newly formed Girl's Industrial School (now Texas Woman's University.) The federation pledged its support to pure food legislation, forest preservation, domestic science in public schools and competitive art among school children. In 1907, during the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations, a "loving cup" was presented to Mrs. Rotan, the first TFWC president.
