

Original TFWC Constitution

Constitution.

Article I. Name.

This Association shall be called the Texas Federation of Women's Literary Clubs.

Article II. Objects.

The objects of this Association shall be to advance and encourage Texas women in literary work, to promote and encourage fraternal intercourse among literary clubs within and without the state, and to secure all the benefits resulting from organized effort.

Article III. Membership.

Any woman's literary club in the state of Texas shall be eligible to membership.

Article IV. Officers.

The officers of this association shall be a President, six Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary or Recording Secretary, Treasurer and an Executive Board.
