RESEARCH ENHANCEMENT GRANTS AWARDED

The Research Support Committee has awarded three Research Enhancement Program grants to the following new faculty:

- Dr. Mark Britt (chemistry and physics), "Stability Curve of Yeast 3-Phosphoglycerate Kinase," \$6,000
- Dr. Anne Scott Stiles (nursing-Denton), "Comparison of Two Maternal Sensitivity Measures in Adolescent Mothers," \$5,993
- Dr. Bonnie Zauderer (nursing-Houston), "The Effects of Dim Light on Patterns of Blood Pressure in Non-Surgical Patients in an Intensive Care Unit," \$5,717.

The awards cover the period from Jan. 1 to Aug. 31. Faculty who are eligible for an award are those who are tenure-track and in the first three years of their appointment at TWU.
