## **CAMPUS COFFEE SET TO WELCOME SURLES**

A campuswide coffee for Dr. Carol Surles has been scheduled on Tues., June 28, from 8:30 to 9:30 a.m. in the southeast room of Hubbard Hall. Surles will make some general remarks at 9:15 a.m. to participants and then speak with area news media. TWU's president-elect, at the invitation of the Board of Regents and Interim President Patricia Sullivan, will visit with Texas Woman's University faculty, staff and students so that the campus community will have an opportunity to meet the incoming chief executive officer. All TWU faculty, staff and students are invited to attend.

Surles, who will begin her tenure as TWU's ninth president on Aug. 10, also will meet with other constituent groups during her visit to Denton.

## **HIGHWAY TRAFFIC MAY REQUIRE ALTERNATE ROUTES**

Travel from Denton during the evening hours has become longer and sometimes more complicated because of construction on Interstate 35-East as existing lanes are resurfaced during the summer and fall months. Drivers will encounter one-lane-only traffic between Denton and Carrollton (southbound) from 6 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, as well as additional potential delays due to unforeseen construction needs. Highway officials expect to finish the project by November; northbound lanes eventually will be affected as well.

Here are some alternate routes to pass along to students, as well as other faculty and staff, who currently are leaving Denton in the afternoon to return home. (While these routes may mean a longer commuting time, drivers likely can avoid sitting in traffic. When construction begins along I-35 East going north to Denton, evening commuters to TWU will need to consider these routes, reversed.)

- Commuters from Arlington, Fort Worth, Hurst/Euless/Bedford -- Take I-35 West to Denton.
- Commuters from the airport area (Grapevine, Colleyville and cities nearby) -- Take I-35 West to Highway 114.
- Commuters from the Plano/Richardson area -- Take Highway 380 East to Preston Road (Highway 289) OR Highway 380 East to Highway 75/Central Expressway.

Faculty, staff and students traveling from other areas should check maps for an alternate route that will accommodate their needs. Updated information on I-35 East construction to and from Denton will be printed in this publication when it is available.

*An additional note:* The number of lanes open to traffic during the day on I-35 East at Teasley Lane is changing as road construction proceeds in that area. Some traffic problems also may occur here; the project is scheduled through September 1995.

## TWU IN THE NEWS

An article in *Women's Day Beauty* on altering metabolism as a means of weight control included the views of Dr. **George Liepa** (family sciences). Liepa advocated eating less fat rather than trying to alter metabolism in other ways. "I think the best approach is to get moderate exercise and to lower the fat content in your diet," he said.

Kenyan recipes collected by Dr. **Evelyn Curry** (Library and Information Studies) during her Fulbright fellowship at Moi University were featured in the *Denton Record-Chronicle*. It took her only two or three months to adapt to Kenyan food, Curry said, adding that the good quality of the beef and vegetables available made "going to a different market every day or so for meat, vegetables and bread really an adventure."

A *Dallas Morning News* article on the area's first radio talk show devoted to women's sports included comments from co-host Dr. **Paula Scott** (communication sciences). The show, heard weekly on *KSKY-AM*, features in-depth reports on women's sports, calls from listeners and celebrity interviews, which Scott conducts. "I want to see women's sports promoted," she said. "I think it's high time women's sports get exposure in the media."

The man behind TWU's national champion gymnastics team, head coach **Frank Kudlac**, was profiled in the *Denton Record-Chronicle*. "I'm not a believer that there's only one way to do something," Kudlac said. "I think I'm good at tailoring whatever it might be into ways of helping gymnasts achieve their goals, and most have gone on to be successful after college."

Dr. **Rudy Rodriguez** (reading and bilingual education) was honored as an "Unsung Hero" by the *Denton Record-Chronicle*. Rodriguez was recognized for championing quality education for Latinos and for seeking out qualified Latino students for scholarships.
