As President of the Texas Federation of Colored Women's Clubs (before the name change in 1956 to the Texas Association of Women's Clubs), she pushed for funds for a Training School for Delinquent Negro Girls.

She began a movement for improved conditions of travel for Negroes on public conveyances in Texas. She made many appeals to railroad companies to push for improvement of these conditions. She also raised funds for a student Loan Fund.

As First Vice President of the NACWC she led the drive to raise funds for the newly purchased National Headquarters in Washington, D. C.
