Professional Achievements	1916: Founded and operated a day nursery in Beaumont. Worked for passage of Federal Anti-Lynching Laws. Worked for Child Labor Laws. 1927 Chair of Ways and Means Committee NACWC.
Organizational Memberships	1925: Chaplain of executive board of the National League of Republican Colored Women.

1911: Read her paper to the Night session of the TFCWC at Austin.

1915: paid for land in order to purchase a girls home.

As President of the Texas Federation of Colored Women's Clubs she laid the foundation for the home for delinquent girls. This became a lengthy 30 year campaign to establish the home.

Worked for elimination of discrimination within the Federal Government. Issues of import for Adams include work and labor laws for women and children, and improvement of all aspects and conditions of life for children.
