In 1916 Alphin resigned as president at the session in Greenville. She moved to New York.

She initiated the first printed minutes for the TAWC. She also wrote "Twinkles From the Lonestar State" in the NACWC Newsletter / Magazine, the report on Texas clubs.

Planned a school for black youth that became Jarvis Christian College (one of the few schools available in East Texas for black youth to complete high school; the only one accredited. (Internet Source: Mary Alphin and Jarvis Christian College).

During her administration issues on the table included health, sanitation, a push for women on the school board, changes in work and labor laws.
