Professional Achievements	Chairman: Peace and Function Committee NACWC. 1941 became first Texan elected as National (NACWC) President. Board of Control NACWC. Sr. Texas State Supervisor of girls. General Committee Texas Commission on Inter-Racial Co-operation.
Organizational Memberships	Women's Auxiliary National Baptist Convention. Secretary of the Executive Committee of Women's Auxiliary.

As State President she activated a state scholarship fund, a training school for delinquent black girls, and a hospital for black tuberculosis patients.

She also worked closely with Texas White Federation Women. Often acted as liason between the two groups.

Her emphasis was on club organization: working on ways to smooth out the work flow. Also worked on increasing club members and the number of clubs. The TACWC doubled in size under her leadership.

As National President she was instrumental in transferring the Frederick Douglass home to the National Association.
