**REQUIREMENTS:**

1. Admission to Teacher Education (application required):
  - Cumulative GPA of 2.75.
  - THEA Scores: Reading 260, Mathematics 240, Writing 240 & or Scores from SAT, ACT or Accuplacer. See Professional Education Advising Center for cut off scores.
  - Demonstration of Oral Communication Proficiency.
2. Teacher certification candidates must pass a basic literacy (THEA) test and TExES tests in Pedagogy and Professional Responsibility (education) and in each content field in which the candidate intends to teach. As of 10/08 Teacher Certification Candidates can take the following tests in place of the THEA test: ACT, SAT, Accuplacer, etc.
3. No grade below a C will be accepted for course work completed in the major or minor.
4. Thirty of the last thirty-six hours must be completed at TWU.
5. Submission of a degree plan, approved and signed by your advisor, is required for successful completion of EDUC 3003.
6. Successful completion of student teaching is required.

**TWU policies, procedures, and requirements are subject to change to be in constant compliance with the state's oversight system for higher education and teacher preparation. Changes become effective upon date of implementation and affect both prospective and continuing students.**

**PROCEDURES:**

1. Once prepared, this degree plan will be submitted to the academic advisor for review and approval.
2. The academic advisor will review and approve the degree plan. The plan will be sent to the Dean's office of Arts and Science, then on to the Student Support office. Check with Student Support to ensure they have received the plan.
3. Plan will be forwarded to the Registrar's office one year prior to graduation for final degree audit.
4. All course substitutions for certification requirements must be approved by the certification officer.
5. The Office of the Registrar will determine that legal and University-wide graduation requirements have been or will be satisfied for graduation.
6. All students must apply for graduation through the Pioneer Portal. Applications and fees must be received by the 12<sup>th</sup> class day of the semester that you plan to graduate (4<sup>th</sup> class day in summer). The candidate for graduation should contact the Registrar's office for steps to be followed for graduation (ordering diploma, invitations, academic regalia, time, place of ceremony, etc.).
7. The Certification Officer will determine whether certification requirements have been met.
