The following ***are deviations to the degree plan and may increase the number of hours required to graduate. Additional upper level hours may need to be added if replaced with lower level courses. PT dept is located in HDB 202.**

**** Students not qualifying for Math 2014 can substitute both MATH 1303 and MATH 1313 in its place.

***** MATH 1703 may be substituted but an additional 3 hour upper level course may need to be taken to reach 36 upper level hours.

***** PT will accept two lower level psychology courses (recommended courses are Developmental or Abnormal) but if lower level is taken an additional 3 hour upper level course may be required to meet the 36 upper level hours.

***** PT will accept Anatomy & Physiology ZOOLOGY 2013/ 11 & ZOOLOGY 2023/21 OR one A&P with lab and one exercise physiology with lab.

Elective options: exercise physiology, neuro anatomy/physiology, biology of aging, physiological psychology

The DOCTOR of PHYSICAL THERAPY (DPT)

A graduate degree is required to enter a career as a physical therapist.^ The Doctor of Physical Therapy degree is a 33 month full time program on the Dallas (accepts 46) and Houston (accepts 50) campuses. **The program begins in the fall of each year. Admission to the DPT program is very competitive.** Applicants typically apply the beginning of their senior year of college. **Average of accepted students last 60 hours GPA is 3.7. Average of accepted students math & science GPA is 3.65.**

Students must meet all requirements for licensure according to State Law and must not have committed any acts which would cause denial. Refer to Article 4512e, Vernon's Civil Statutes, Section 2D for such requirements for Texas. It is the responsibility of the student to make sure they meet these requirements.

Deadline of November 1st (a year prior to the start of program)

1. Completion of bachelor's degree and required prerequisites before DPT program begins.
2. GRE exam
3. Campus preference letter, resume, interest letter
4. 2 Recommendation forms from licensed PTs in two differently owned facilities after 20 hours in each (total of 40 hours observation/volunteer/or employment as PT tech) Many applicants have 300-400 hours. Forms are found on the PT website.
5. 1 recommendation form from an employer or professor

NOTES:

1. By state law the candidate must have credit for six (6) semester hours of American History. Texas History may substitute for three (3) semester hours.
2. By state law the candidate must have credit for six (6) semester hours of federal and state constitutions. ROTC credit at a senior institution may be substituted.
3. Majors: Majors are defined as a minimum of thirty (30) semester hours. One-half (1/2) of these hours must be advanced. A Minimum of 36 advanced hours is required for any baccalaureate degree.

4. Minors: Most minors at Texas Woman's University include a minimum of eighteen (18) hours. A minor includes a minimum of 6 credit hours at the advanced level. Students should consider the state excess hours rule when considering earning a minor.
5. At least one-half (1/2) of the upper level courses in the major and at least one-half of the upper level courses in the minor must be completed at TWU.
6. A Minimum of 25% of the credit hours must be taken at TWU. Correspondence and credit-by-examination courses do not satisfy residence requirements for graduation.
7. A student who holds a valid bachelor's degree from another accredited college or university and who wishes to earn a second bachelor's degree at TWU must complete the following legal requirements: Six (6) semester hours of American History, six (6) semester hours of national and state governments, and thirty-six (36) semester hours of advanced studies, and meet departmental and residential requirements.
8. Students may transfer no more than 84 semester hours from junior or community colleges. There is no limit for transfer credit from senior institutions.
