Veteran's pre-registration began on Nov 5th with a rocky start, but things are now running smoothly. After you have registered for your classes make sure to submit the [Veterans Intent to Register Form](#) which is available at our website. Without this form the TWU Veterans Program office cannot submit your 2010/Spring pre-enrollment status to the VA.

During registration please keep in mind that the VA will only pay for the classes that are listed on the Degree Plan (No DARS). You can request a copy of your degree plan from your academic advisor. For additional information please review the [Continuing Student Checklist](#).

Required documents

As of January 8, 2009 the Department of Veterans Affairs requires all veterans receiving the GI Bill benefits to submit their DD214 and military transcripts to TWU within their first semester. This means many continuing veterans will need to submit these documents by May 14, 2010.

The TWU Veterans Program will be notifying veterans who are missing these documents during the 2010/Spring term via email.
