Momentum: Strategic Plan 2028 – Dr. Chad Smith, Sharon Bailey

Administration is eager to hear your ideas for the new strategic plan; please follow the typical path (component admin, Dean) for sharing ideas or bring your ideas directly to the strategic planning team, preferably to the relevant direction; some monies may be available later.

Fulbright - Dr. Annie Phillips Munson, Dr. Richard Shuster

Support is available for students and faculty; Fulbright is very serious about diversity, equity, and inclusion, HSI and minority serving institutions; many student recipients are first time in college, low income, diverse. Students typically apply in junior year to go abroad for 8-12 months after graduation; graduate students may also apply. Faculty may be interested in the specialist program, which is a 2-6-week commitment; likened to a consulting gig, can include teaching and/or research, all expenses paid plus stipend, it's a matter of getting an institution to apply and choose you; concerns mentioned about

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faculty leave policy. Qualifications include being a U.S. citizen, compelling project pitch, if you don't speak a second language there are still opportunities but fewer.

Speaker Report

Welcome and/or welcome back to new and returning senators: Christie Acho, Ashley Bender, Amy Burke, Megan Burke, Suzanna Dillon, Jayne Dunlap, Gayle Night, Aaron Norton, Sheli Petersen, Misty Richmond, Supriya Sen, and Alisa Woods. Senate's main focus this year is on compensation, ad hoc committee to discuss inequity, inversion, compression, and market rates and we are starting to see some movement on the issue; planning to request 5%; planning to make compensation a yearly study, there are many options to consider in compensation; grateful for the increased transparency and functional working relationship with the Provost's Office. Senate is also looking to secure representation on the Board of Regents and with the Cabinet. Speaker is waiting to receive the policy review schedule from Dr. Miloch; senate can review any policy even if it's not scheduled for review. Parental leave was outside the charge of the previous workload committee, senate will be looking at that. Check to see who you are representing in case you have more people than are in your component.

Speaker Pro Tem Report

Concerns about SB 17 affecting scholarship have been brought to the senate's EIAR committee; if you have concerns that your scholarship is being affected (e.g. internal grants) please contact EIAR.

Interim Provost's Forum

Chancellor requested Compensation Committee to look at how various funds are being used and to compare where we are in respect to other institutions. Provost Fellows for faculty interested in higher ed administration. Waiting for the new budget, previous budget holds per Tomlinson. Enrollment down at the graduate level and up at undergraduate; semester credit hours matter to revenue. Physical Therapy moving to Denton, hiring faculty for programs that need more to meet accreditation; ELO PhD growing. Best QEP SACS has seen; two areas for refinement, faculty sufficiency and job descriptions for program administrators. Aviation school had to be resubmitted to THECB under new rules, should get decision by October with SACS approval soon after; excellent candidates to run Aviation school and should finalize hiring soon. When will the TWU peers on the THECB website be updated? Programs should look at their CUPA peers, probably not the official peers by THECB. What is the timeline for HEF proposals? Once the funds are known, work on priorities from two pots, one pot for furniture and money for library renovations. How should non-degree programs (like gateway courses for First Time in

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College) advocate for needs? Advocate through your Dean. When was the last time TWU had an outside audit? The state requires an audit every three years, not sure about rules on outside auditors; internal audits are ongoing, reported at Board of Regents meetings, audit results have to be available to the public, perhaps auditor speak to senate. Mark Hamner has the data on SCH production, dorm preference given to students enrolled in face-to-face courses. Some programs like Teacher Education are very full, looking at options for funding (e.g. visiting line) to see if programs continue to perform.
