NOTES:

1. By state law the candidate must have credit for six (6) semester hours of American History.
2. By state law the candidate must have credit for six (6) semester hours of Federal and State Government.
3. Courses for core credit must be approved for core at the time taken at TWU or at other state public institution, or a core equivalency must be established according to university procedures.
4. Major: The Catalog defines the requirements of a major as a minimum of thirty (30) semester hours, with 15 advanced and 8 taken in residency at TWU.
5. Minor: The catalog defines the requirements of a minor as a minimum of eighteen (18) semester hours including six (6) advanced hours with three (3) completed in residency at TWU.
6. The B.S. degree requires a minimum of thirty-six (36) advanced hours.
7. Thirty (30) of the last thirty-six (36) hours must be completed in residency at TWU.
8. A student may transfer no more than 72 semester hours from junior or community colleges. There is no maximum number of semester hours transferable from senior colleges.
9. A student who holds a valid Bachelor's Degree from another accredited college or university and who wishes to earn a second Bachelor's Degree at TWU must complete the following legal requirements: six (6) semester hours of American History; six (6) semester hours of National and State Government; thirty-six (36) semester hours of advanced studies; and, meet departmental, residency requirements.

PROCEDURES:

1. The student will verify all courses satisfactorily completed and those to be completed by semester and year.
2. Once approved by the RN Coordinator, the degree plan will be forwarded to the Registrar's Office one year preceding the semester of graduation.
3. The RN Coordinator will authorize substitutions in the listing of major courses.
4. The Registrar's Office will notify the candidate for graduation of steps to be followed for graduation (ordering diploma, invitations, academic regalia, and time and place of ceremony).
5. The catalog carrying the date a student was first enrolled in an accredited college or university may dictate the requirements for graduation for a five-year period. Beyond this time a new catalog must be consulted. The Advisor and Student should agree on the catalog date to be used and enter this information in the space designated "Catalog Date" on the opposite side of this form. This rule may be superseded by state law.
6. The student must file an *Application for Graduation* by the date specified in the **Schedule of Classes** for the semester they are eligible to graduate and pay the required fee.
