Dr. Fisher was named one of the *100 Most Influential Persons in Occupational Therapy in the First Century of the Profession*. He served as a CARF Surveyor for 20 years and served on Case Management Society of America's Task Force to establish the standards for case management. He has multiple publications, presentations and grant funding.

Higher Education's Role in the Future of US Healthcare

This lecture will stress the significant influence that Universities have on healthcare. Health professionals have a continued responsibility to commit to life-long learning. Current trends in health and human services in the United States will be explored with a focus on clinical implications. Understanding and appreciating the direction of the World Health Organization (WHO), the National Academy of Medicine (formerly, the Institute of Medicine), US Health Policy, Translational Research and Healthy People 2020 is critical for occupational therapy colleagues, as it sets the stage for us locally at our institutions and facilities. This lecture will include conversations about plans for organizations to prepare for the next generation of occupational therapy practitioners, scientists and educators.

The Vanderkooi Endowed Lectureship was established in 1994 to honor the first program director of occupational therapy at Texas Woman's University, Fanny B. Vanderkooi.
